What you will need:

RED HEART® Soft®: 1 ball each A 4600 White and B 9925 Really Red

Susan Bates® Double-Pointed Knitting Needles: 3.5mm [US 4]

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 4.00 mm [US 6]

Stitch markers, yarn needle, 2 – ¼" (6 mm) black beads (2 beads for eyes per bear), 2-5 – ¼" (6 mm) white buttons (3 buttons for front, and 2 buttons on back for long underwear version), Sewing needle and black thread
Embroidery needle and black floss, Straight pins
Polyester fiberfill

GAUGE: 20 sts = 4" (10 cm); 32 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette stitch on size 3.5mm [US 4] needles.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

RED HEART® Soft®, Art. E728 available in solid color 5 oz (140 g), 256 yd (234 m) and print 4 oz (113 g), 204 yd (187 m) balls



Polar Bear Ornaments

Create a family of cool bears to join in the holiday festivities. The fun-to-knit characters are irresistibly cute and great to give or enjoy yourself!

Bears Measure: Standing version:
5" (13 cm) tall
Seated version: 6" (15 cm) tall

Special Stitches

KFB = Knit 1 stitch in the front, then in the back. Increase is made.

SSK = Slip, slip, knit slipped stitches together. Decrease is made.

K2tog = Knit 2 sts together.

Stitch Patterns

K1 x P1 Rib

Row 1: *K1, P 1* across Row.

Next Row: Knit the knit sts, Purl the purl sts for K1 x P1 Rib pattern.

Notes

1. Pattern makes 6 different versions of bears using simple color patterns and either seated or standing positioning of body parts when sewing together.
2. All versions are worked in the round on smaller size needles. Stuffing is added as rounds are completed. Body parts are made separately, then sewn together using yarn ends.
3. Facial features are made by using either small or medium size beads for eyes and floss for embroidered nose. Use photo as a guide for placement.

BEAR Head

Using **A** and smaller needles, cast on 6 stitches, place marker, (place 2 sts on each of 3 needles). Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Round 1: *Kfb in next st; repeat from * around – 12 sts.

Round 2: Knit around.

Round 3: *K1, kfb in next st; repeat from * around – 18 sts.

Round 4: Knit around.

Round 5: *K2, kfb in next st; repeat from * around – 24 sts.

Round 6: Knit around.

Round 7: *K3, kfb in next st; repeat from * around – 30 sts.

Round 8-11: Knit around.

Round 12: K2, ssk, k6, k2tog, k6, ssk, k6, k2tog, k2 – 26 sts.

Round 13: K2, ssk, k4, k2tog, k6, ssk, k4, k2tog, k2 – 22 sts.

Round 14: K2, ssk, k2, k2tog, k6, ssk, k2, k2tog, k2 – 18 sts. Stuff as rounds are completed.

Round 15: K2, ssk, k2tog, k6, ssk, k2tog, k2 – 14 sts.

Round 16-18: Knit around.

Round 19: *K2, k2tog* 3 times, k2 – 11 sts. Stuff head firmly. Finish off by weaving yarn end through remaining live sts, pulling tightly to close opening, knot to secure. Leave yarn ends for attaching head to body.

Ears (make 2)

Using A and smaller size needles, cast on 5 stitches. Rounds 1-2: Knit. Weave yarn end through live sts and pull tightly to close. Knot to secure. Leave yarn ends for attaching ears to head.

Tail (make 1)

Using A and smaller size needles, cast on 5 stitches. Round 1: Knit. Weave yarn end through live sts and pull tightly to close. Knot to secure. Leave yarn ends for attaching tail to body.

Basic Body

Using **A** and smaller size needles, cast on 18 stitches, place marker, (place 6 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Rounds 1-3: Knit around.

Round 4: *K2, kfb; repeat from * around – 24 sts. Rounds 5-7: Knit around.

Continued...

Round 8: *K3, kfb; repeat from * around – 30 sts.

Rounds 9-11: Knit around.

Round 12: *K4, kfb; repeat from * around – 36 sts.

Rounds 13-27: Knit around.

Round 28: *K4, k2tog; repeat from * around – 30 sts.

Round 29: Knit around.

Round 30: *K3, k2tog; repeat from * around – 24 sts.

Round 31: Knit around.

Round 32: *K2, k2tog; repeat from * around – 18 sts.

Round 33: Knit around.

Round 34: *K1, k2tog; repeat from * around – 12 sts.

Round 35: *K1, k2tog; repeat from * around – 8 sts.

Stuff body firmly. Finish off by weaving yarn end through live sts and pulling tightly to close, knot to secure. Leave yarn end from cast on edge for attaching head to body.

BODY VARIATIONS

Striped Sweater Body

Using **B** and smaller size needles, cast on 18 stitches, place marker, (place 6 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Rounds 1-2: Knit around.

Rounds 3-4: Using **A**, knit around for 2 Rounds. Do not cut **B**, carry non-working yarn (**B**), loosely along back unless otherwise directed.

Rounds 5-22: Working in stripe pattern of 2 Rounds per color – **B, A, B, A**, follow the directions for the Basic Body, finishing off with **B** at end of Round 22.

Rounds 23-35: Continue Rounds as for Basic Body, using **A** only. Stuff firmly, finish off as per Basic Body.

Long Underwear Body

Using **B** and smaller size needles, cast on 18 stitches, place marker, (place 6 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Follow Rounds 1-35 for Basic Body. Stuff and finish off as directed above.

Add long underwear details by sewing 3 - ¼" (6 mm) buttons down the front and 2 buttons on either side of tail to simulate the back flap.

Basic Legs (make 4)

Using **A** and smaller size needles, cast on 10 stitches, place marker, (place 3-3-4 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Rounds 1-15: Knit around.

Round 16: *K1, kfb; repeat from * around – 15 sts.

Round 17: *K2, kfb; repeat from * around – 20 sts.

Round 18: **K** around. Stuff Leg as rounds are completed.

Round 19: *K2, k2tog; repeat from * around – 15 sts.

Round 20: *K1, k2tog; repeat from * around – 10 sts.

Complete stuffing Leg. Finish off by weaving yarn end through live sts and pulling tightly to close, knot to secure. Leave yarn ends from cast on edge for attaching Legs to Body.

LEG VARIATIONS

Striped Sweater Leg Variation

Make Striped version for only 2 of the 4 Legs, (the lower Legs are worked in solid **A**).

Using **B** and smaller size needles, cast on 10 sts, place marker, (place 3-3-4 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Round 1: Using **B**, knit around.

Rounds 2-3: Using **A**, knit around.

Rounds 4-9: Continue working in stripe pattern of 2 Rounds per color finishing off with **B** at end of Round 9.

Rounds 10-20: Using **A**, complete rounds as for Basic Legs. Finish off as directed, repeat for second Leg. Work lower 2 Legs in solid **A**.

Long Underwear Leg Variation

Using **B** and smaller size needles, cast on 10 stitches, place marker, (place 3-3-4 sts on each of 3 needles).

Join, being careful not to twist sts.

Rounds 1-12: Knit around finishing off with **B** at end of Round 12.

Rounds 13-20: Using **A**, complete Rounds 13-20 as for Basic Legs. Finish off as per Basic Legs, repeat for remaining legs.

SCARF

Using **B** and larger size needles, cast on 8 stitches.

Do not join, work back and forth in rows.

Row 1: K1, P1 across row.

Next Rows: Continue working in K1 x P1 rib until piece measures approximately 9" (23 cm) from cast on edge. Bind off all sts, trim and weave in ends.

FINISHING

Refer to photo for placement of facial features, head and leg positions.

Using black thread, sewing needle and 2 black beads, sew beads to front of head for eyes, using the beginning of the decrease Rounds to mark the eye placement.

Using black floss and embroidery needle, embroider nose in a triangle shape at the small tip of the head. **Note:** Do not separate strands of floss, use as one single strand. Position and pin the ears to the back sides of the head. Attach ears by sewing securely to head using yarn tail. Knot, weave in ends and trim yarn end.

Position and pin the tail in the middle of the lower back of the body. Attach tail by sewing securely to back of body using yarn tail. Knot, weave in ends and trim yarn end.

FINISHING for Seated bear

Using yarn ends, attach head paying close attention to the positioning of the Head. Set Body portion on end with the fat portion sitting on the table and the neck opening upwards towards the ceiling. Attach the Head by placing the fatter portion of the stuffed head on top of the neck opening, (Teddy Bear style), with the nose pointing outward, (parallel to the table), making certain that the front of the Body and the front of the Head are consistent. Sew securely with yarn end, weaving and trimming ends. Using yarn ends attach the arms (Legs) to sides of the top portion of the Body, about 4-5 rounds from the neck opening. Weave and trim excess yarn. Using yarn ends, attach bottom Legs to front lower portion of Body, making certain the Legs are situated correctly as to allow the bear to sit Teddy Bear style.

FINISHING for Standing Bear

Using yarn ends, attach the Head paying close attention to the positioning of the Head. Lay the stuffed Body on its side, on the table. Position the Head with the cast on round in the middle of the neck opening, (and the nose pointing straight ahead, in same direction of the Body). Head and Body should lie in a straight line. Attach using yarn end, trimming excess yarn.

Sew Legs to the underside of the Body so that the bear can stand on all fours. Tip: Pin or baste Legs in position so changes can easily be made before committing to finished stitching.

If using a scarf, loop around the neck and tie once in front.

What you will need:

RED HEART® Soft: 2 ball each 9925 Really Red A and 4600 White B for all ornaments

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 4.0 mm [US 6] and 5.0 mm [US 8] double-pointed needles for Balls; 5.5mm [US 9] for Stars

4" [10 cm] foam balls, fiberfill stuffing, stitch marker, yarn needle

GAUGE: 20 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 22 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Stockinette stitch with 5.0mm [US8] for Balls; 20 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 20 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Stockinette stitch with 5.5mm [US9] for stars. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

RED HEART® Soft®, Art. E728 solid colors available in 5 oz (141 g), 256 yd (234 m) balls



Holiday Stars and Balls Ornaments

Red and white ornaments will add a wonderful pop of color to your tree! Knit them and use them year after year, for if they fall, they will not break!

Ball ornaments measure 4" [10 cm];

Stars measure 6" [15 cm] across.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

kf&b = knit into front and back of next stitch.

M1 = Make 1 (Inc) – Lift strand between needles to left-hand needle and work strand through the back loop, twisting it to prevent a hole, [knit or purl as indicated by pattern st].

SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

I-cord = Knit specified number of sts, *slide all sts to opposite end of double-pointed needle; carrying yarn tightly across back of work, knit to end of row, do not turn; repeat from * to desired cord length.

Notes

1. Ball ornaments begin with I-cord loop, then are worked in the round. Directions are for Norwegian Lace Ball; changes for Diamonds and Snowflake Balls are in parentheses.
2. Star points are worked individually and sewn together into star. Directions are for Stripe Star; changes for Red Star and White Star are in parentheses.

BALL ORNAMENTS

Hanging Loop

With smaller needles and **B (A, B)**, cast on 4 sts. Work I-cord for 3" [7.6 cm].

Shape Top

Increase row (Right Side): Kf&b in each st—8 sts.

Distribute sts evenly to remaining double-pointed needles and join to work in rounds, being careful not to twist sts. Place marker for beginning of round. Knit 1 round.

Round 1: Kf&b in each st—16 sts.

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: Kf&b in each st—32 sts.

Round 4: Knit.

Round 5: [K3, kf&b] 8 times—40 sts.

Round 6: Knit.

Round 7: [K4, kf&b] 8 times—48 sts.

Round 8: Knit.

Round 9: [K5, kf&b] 8 times—56 sts.

Round 10: Knit.

Round 11: [K6, kf&b] 8 times—64 sts.

Round 12: Change to larger needles, knit. Work 13-round intarsia chart for Norwegian Lace (Diamonds, Snowflake) pattern.

Shape Bottom

Next round: With **A (A, B)**, knit.

Insert foam ball and continue knitting around it. Change to smaller needles; knit 1 round.

Round 1: [K6, k2tog] 8 times—56 sts.

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: [K5, k2tog] 8 times—48 sts.

Round 4: Knit.

Round 5: [K4, k2tog] 8 times—40 sts.

Round 6: Knit.

Round 7: [K3, k2tog] 8 times—32 sts.

Round 8: Knit.

Round 9: [K2tog] 16 times—16 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving tail; draw tail through remaining 16 sts twice and pull to close opening. Fasten off.

Finishing

Sew cast-on end of I-cord to top of ball, forming a loop. Weave in ends.

STAR ORNAMENTS

Star Points, Back (Make 5)

With **A (A, B)** and larger needles, cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (Right Side): Knit.

Row 2: P1, M1, purl to end—4 sts.

Row 3: K1, M1, knit to end—5 sts.

Repeat last 2 rows, increasing 1 st each row to 12 sts, end on a Row 3.

Row 1 (Right Side): K2tog, knit to end—11 sts.

Continued...

Row 2: P2tog, purl to end—10 sts.
Repeat last 2 rows, decreasing 1 st each row to 2 sts, end on a Row 1. Cut yarn, fasten off.
Star Points, Front (Make 5)
Following Stripe (Red Star, White Star)
intarsia charts, make star points as for back.

Finishing

Using photo as guide, arrange 5 star points for Back with decrease ends together at center; sew points together. Repeat for Front star points.
With right sides together, sew all but 1 star edges together; turn start right side out. Stuff star with fiberfill. Sew final edge closed. Weave in ends.
Cut 6" [15 cm] strand of **B (B, A)**. With yarn needle, thread yarn through top star point, tie in a bow.



RED HEART® Super Saver®: small amount 319 Cherry Red

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 6mm [US]-10]

GAUGE: Gauge is not important for this project.

4" (10 cm) diameter Styrofoam® ball, faux mistletoe (use bunch of mistletoe and cut it into smaller sprigs), straight pins, ribbon bow (optional), glue

7 oz (198 g), 364 yd (333 m); prints, multicolor and heather 5 oz (141 g), 236 yd (215 m), flecks 5 oz (141 g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins



Holiday Kissing Ball

Encourage Santa to kiss mama under the mistletoe with this quick and crafty Kissing Ball. It's the perfect way to add a spark of color and softness to your Christmas decorating.

BALL

1. Make a ruffled scarf with one hank of the Sassy Fabric. See pattern LW4170 or video.
2. Pin scarf to ball going in vertical rows so that you only have one layer of ruffles covering the whole ball, see Photo A.



3. Pin sprigs of mistletoe around the ball, see Photo B.

Hanging Loop

Using a yard or so of yarn, crochet a chain and then do a row of single crochets into chain. Pin to top of ball and secure with a dab of glue.

What you will need:

RED HEART® Anne Geddes Baby™: 1 ball each 112 Night-night A, 100 Lily B, and 902 Lady Bug C

Knitting Needles: 3.25 mm [US 3] double-pointed needles for body, 4.0 mm [US 6] for scarf

Two ¼" [6 mm] black shank buttons for eyes, stitch markers, yarn needle, fiberfill for stuffing, yellow embroidery floss for nose, embroidery needle, black sewing thread, sewing needle, crochet hook for attaching scarf fringe

GAUGE: 22 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 38 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Stockinette stitch. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size needle to obtain the tension/gauge.

Buy Yarn



RED HEART® Anne Geddes Baby™, Art. E805 available in solid 3.5 oz (100 g) 340 yd (310 m) and multi 3.5 oz (100 g) 290 yd (265 m) balls



Cheerful Holiday Penguin

Knit this whimsical penguin to keep you company all winter long. Change the scarf shade and create a colorful colony of penguins!

Penguin measures 6" [15 cm] tall.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

kfb = knit into front and back of next stitch.

SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

Intarsia = Work chart sts in color specified, leaving yarns not in use hanging in back until working back to that area. Twist yarns around each other at color changes to prevent holes.

PATTERN STITCHES

1 x 1 Rib (multiple of 2 sts)

All rows: *K1, p1; repeat from * to end.

Notes

1. Body is worked flat from head down and seamed at center back. Wings are worked separately in the round.
2. Use photo(s) as guide for assembling pieces.

PENGUIN

With smaller needles and **A**, cast on 8 sts.

Head

Row 1 (Right Side): K1, [kfb]

6 times, k1 – 14 sts.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, [k1, kfb] 6 times, k1 – 20 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Round 5: K1, [k2, kfb] 6 times, k1 – 26 sts.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K1, [k3, kfb] 6 times, k1 – 32 sts.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K1, [k4, kfb] 6 times, k1 – 38 sts.

Round 10: Purl.

Continue using intarsia techniques for face, joining yarns and changing colors as directed. Do not cut yarn; carry color not in use forward.

Row 11: With **A**, k15; with **B**, k3; with **A**, k2; with **B**, k3; with **A**, k15.

Row 12: With **A**, p13; with **B**, p12; with **A**, p13.

Row 13: With **A**, k13; with **B**, k12; with **A**, k13.

Repeat last 2 rows 2 more times.

Row 18 (Decrease): With **A**, p1, [p4, p2tog] twice; with **B**, [p4, p2tog] twice; with **A**, [p4, p2tog] twice, p1 – 32 sts.

Row 19: With **A**, k11; with **B**, k10; with **A**, k11.

Row 20: With **A**, p11; with **B**, p10; with **A**, p11.

Body

Joining **C** as indicated, begin stripe chest pattern.

Row 1: With **A**, k11; with **C**, k10; with **A**, k11.

Row 2: With **A**, p11; with **C**, p10; with **A**, p11.

Row 3 (Increase): With **A**, k1, [kfb, k4] twice; with **B**, kfb, k8, kfb; with **A**, [k4, kfb] twice; k1 – 38 sts.

Row 4: With **A**, p13; with **B**, p12; with **A**, p13.

Row 5: With **A**, k13; with **C**, k12; with **A**, k13.

Row 6: With **A**, p13; with **C**, p12; with **A**, p13.

Row 7: With **A**, k13; with **B**, k12; with **A**, k13.

Row 8: With **A**, p13; with **B**, p12; with **A**, p13. Repeat Rows 5-8 5 more times; work Rows 5 and 6 one more time. Cut **B** and **C**; continue with **A**.

Work 2 rows even in St st.

Row 1: K1, [k4, k2tog] 6 times, k1 – 32 sts.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, [k3, k2tog] 6 times, k1 – 26 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1, [k2, k2tog] 6 times, k1 – 20 sts.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K1, [k1, k2tog] 6 times, k1 – 14 sts.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K1, [k2tog] 6 times, k1 – 8 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail for seaming. Weave tail through remaining sts and pull to gather.

WINGS (Make 2)

With smaller needles, **A**, and leaving 15 cm [6"] tail, cast on 12 sts. Place marker for beginning of round. Join to work in rounds, being careful not to twist the sts. Knit 10 rounds.

Next round: [K2tog, k4] twice – 10 sts. Knit 5 rounds.

Next round: [K2tog, k3] twice – 8 sts.

Next round: [K2tog, k2] twice – 6 sts.

Continued...

Cut yarn; weave tail through remaining sts and pull to gather. Fasten off.

SCARF

With larger needles and **C**, cast on 8 sts. Work 1 x 1 Rib until scarf measures 25.5 cm [10"]. Cast off. Cut 12 5 cm [2"] lengths of **C**, 6 for each end of scarf. For each knot, fold strand in half; insert crochet hook through edge, place fold on hook and pull through fabric. Tuck ends through loop just formed and pull to tighten. When all fringe are attached, trim to same length. Repeat for other end.

FINISHING

Use photo as guide for finishing. With tails, sew back seam of penguin head and body, working from both directions toward center back and leaving a small opening. Stuff body; sew opening closed.

Head

Mark eye position on face per photo. With sewing needle and thread, sew buttons in place. With embroidery thread, embroider beak in triangle shape between eyes.

Wings

Holding wings at cast-on end, position on either side of body a few rows below the neck. With tail, sew top of wing to body. Weave in ends. Tie scarf around neck.

Throw measures 47" wide x 55" long (119.5 x 139.5 cm).
Pillow measures 16" (40.5 cm) diameter.

Special Stitches

beg dc2tog = (Ch 2, dc) in next stitch.
dc2tog = [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 2 times, yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Special Technique

Interlocking crochet = Work the current round in front of the previous round but not into its stitches. Insert the hook through the chain space of the previous round and into the indicated stitch or chain space of same color round as your current yarn. As you work the new stitch, bring it forward through the chain space of the previous round. For example, in Round 3 (worked with **A**), insert the hook in the next chain space of Round 2 and, pulling the stitch forward, work in the indicated stitch of Round 1 (worked with **A**). Do not work over or into the stitches of Round 2.

Notes

1. Throw motifs and pillow are made with interlocking crochet technique in joined rounds with right side facing at all times.
2. Last loop of each round is dropped after round is joined; next color is returned to the hook and worked in front of previous round. Colors are alternated as this sequence is repeated. Be sure to bring working yarn and loop of color not in use to front of piece when instructed. Do not cut yarn until instructed.
3. **A** stitches are only worked in **A** stitches of odd-numbered rounds and **B** stitches are only worked in **B** stitches of even-numbered rounds.

4. You may find it helpful to enlarge the dropped loop or place it on a locking stitch marker so it doesn't unravel as you work the next round.
5. Pillow is made in one piece with first side worked in increasing interlocked rounds and second side worked in decreasing interlocked rounds. Pillow form is inserted before last rounds are worked.

THROW

Large Motif (make 42: 10 with Edging #1, 10 with Edging #2, 9 with Edging #3, 9 with Edging #4, 2 with Edging #5, 2 with Edging #6)

With **A**, ch 4; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), dc in ring, [ch 1, dc in ring] 6 times, ch 1; join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch—8 dc and 8 ch-1 spaces worked with **A**. At the end of each round, drop and enlarge the loop on the hook so that it doesn't unravel as you work the next round. If desired, place loop on a stitch marker.

Round 2: With **B**, working in front of Round 1, join **B** with slip st in beginning ring between the beginning ch and first dc of Round 1, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), dc in ring between next 2 dc, [ch 1, dc in ring between next 2 dc] 6 times, ch 1, bring **A** loop and working yarn to the front of piece; working behind the **A** loop and working yarn, join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch—8 dc and 8 ch-1 spaces worked with **B**.

Notes for Rounds 3–10

Begin interlocking technique. Current round is always worked in front of previous round but not into its stitches. **A** stitches are only worked in **A** stitches of odd-numbered rounds and **B** stitches are only worked in **B** stitches of even-numbered rounds.

Continued...

Round 3: Place **A** loop back on hook, slip st in first ch-1 space, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in same space, bring **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-1 space] 7 times, ch 2; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 dc and 8 ch-2 spaces with **A**.

Round 4: Place **B** loop back on hook, slip st in first ch-1 space, ch 3, dc in same space, [ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 2] 7 times, ch 2, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 dc and 8 ch-2 spaces with **B**.

Round 5: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 3, skip next dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space] 7 times, ch 3; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—24 dc and 8 ch-3 spaces with **A**.

Round 6: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, 2 dc in next ch-2 space, [ch 3, skip next dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 space] 7 times, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—24 dc and 8 ch-3 spaces with **B**.

Round 7: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-3 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 4, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-3 space] 7 times, ch 4; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—32 dc and 8 ch-4 spaces with **A**.

Round 8: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-3 space, [skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-3 space, ch 4] 7 times, ch 4, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—32 dc and 8 ch-4 spaces with **B**.

Round 9: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 5, skip next dc, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 5; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—40 dc and 8 ch-5 spaces with **A**.

Round 10: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space, [ch 5, skip next dc, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 5, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—40 dc and 8 ch-5 spaces with **B**. Fasten off **B**.

Edging

Notes for Large Motif Edgings #1–#6

All edging stitches are worked in **A** stitches of Round 9. As instructed, work in front of or behind, but not into, **B** stitches of previous round. After completion, label each motif with its edging number for easier identification when assembling throw.

Edging #1: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in same ch-5 space, [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in same ch-5 space] 7 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—80 dc and 8 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Edging #2: Place **A** loop back on hook, working in front of **B** sts, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-5 space (corner made), [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-5

space (corner made)] 7 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—80 dc and 8 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Edging #3: Place **A** loop back on hook, working in front of **B** sts, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in same ch-5 space, [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in same ch-5 space] 4 times, working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space, [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space] 2 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—88 dc and 6 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Edging #4: Place **A** loop back on hook, working in front of **B** sts, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, (4 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in same ch-5 space (corner made), [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-5 space (corner made)] 4 times, working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 2, 4 dc) in next ch-5 space (corner made), [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space] 2 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—88 dc and 6 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Edging #5: Place **A** loop back on hook, working in front of **B** sts, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in next ch-5 space,

[working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 4 dc in same ch-5 space] 2 times, working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 2 dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dc (corner made), dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space, [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space] 4 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—92 dc and 4 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Edging #6: Place **A** loop back on hook, working in front of **B** sts, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, (4 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in same ch-5 space (corner made), [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-5 space (corner made)] 2 times, working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, working behind **B** sts, (3 dc, ch 2, 4 dc) in next ch-5 space (corner made), [working in front of **B** sts, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, working behind **B** sts, 6 dc in same ch-5 space] 4 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—92 dc and 4 corners. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Small Motif (make 30)

With **A**, ch 4; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.

Rounds 1–2: Work same as Rounds 1–2 of large motif—8 dc and 8 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off **B**.

Round 3: Place **A** loop back on hook, slip st in first ch-1 space, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in same space, [ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-1 space] 7 times, ch 2; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 dc and 8 ch-2 spaces.

Continued...

Round 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as join, *ch 3, 2 dc in next dc (corner made), 2 hdc in next ch-2 space, sc in next 2 dc, 2 hdc in next ch-2 space, 2 dc in next dc, repeat from * 3 times, ch 3, 2 dc in next dc (corner made), 2 hdc in next ch-2 space, sc in next 2 dc, 2 hdc in last ch-2 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—40 sts and 4 corners.

ASSEMBLY

With right sides facing, arrange large motifs as shown in assembly diagram. Using photograph as a guide, position rounded edges of motifs with edgings #3–#6 facing outwardly. Place small motifs in spaces between large motifs. Sew all motifs together.

FINISHING

Border

Round 1: With right side facing, join **A** with slip st in back loop of any dc, working in back loops only, slip st in each dc around; join with slip st in first slip st. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

PILLOWCASE

Rounds 1–8: Work same as Rounds 1–8 of large motif—32 dc and 8 ch-4 spaces with **B**.

Round 9: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 5, skip next dc, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 5; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—40 dc and 8 ch-5 spaces with **A**.

Round 10: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space, [ch 5, skip next dc, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 5, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—40 dc and 8 ch-5 spaces with **B**.

Round 11: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 6, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space] 7 times, ch 6; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—48 dc and 8 ch-6 spaces with **A**.

Round 12: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space, [ch 6, skip next dc, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-5 space] 7 times, ch 6, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—48 dc and 8 ch-6 spaces with **B**.

Round 13: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-6 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 7, skip next dc, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next ch-6 space] 7 times, ch 7; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—56 dc and 8 ch-7 spaces with **A**.

Round 14: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next ch-6 space, [ch 7, skip next dc, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next ch-6 space] 7 times, ch 7, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—56 dc and 8 ch-7 spaces with **B**.

Round 15: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next ch-7 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 8, skip next dc, dc in next 6 dc, 2 dc in next ch-7 space] 7 times, ch 8; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—64 dc and 8 ch-8 spaces with **A**.

Round 16: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next ch-7 space, [ch 8, skip next dc, dc in next 6 dc, 2 dc in next ch-7 space] 7 times, ch 8, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—64 dc and 8 ch-8 spaces with **B**.

Continued..



Round 39: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next 2 dc, dc in next ch-5 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 4, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next 2 dc, dc in next ch-5 space] 7 times, ch 4; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—32 dc and 8 ch-4 spaces with **A**.

Round 40: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next 2 dc, dc in next ch-5 space, [ch 4, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next 2 dc, dc in next ch-5 space] 7 times, ch 4, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—32 dc and 8 ch-4 spaces with **B**. Insert pillow form inside pillow and work remaining rounds to encase the pillow form.

Round 41: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc in next ch-4 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 3, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 3; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—24 dc and 8 ch-3 spaces with **A**.

Round 42: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc in next ch-4 space, [ch 3, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc in next ch-4 space] 7 times, ch 3, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—24 dc and 8 ch-3 spaces with **B**.

Round 43: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next ch-3 space, bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 2, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next ch-3 space] 7 times, ch 2; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 dc and 8 ch-2 spaces with **A**.

Round 44: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, beg dc2tog, dc in next ch-3 space, [ch 2, skip next dc, dc2tog, dc in next ch-3 space] 7 times, ch 2, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 dc and 8 ch-2 spaces with **B**.

Round 45: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, (ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 space (beg dc2tog made), bring dropped **B** loop and working yarn to front of piece, [ch 1, skip next dc, dc2tog working first “leg” in next dc and 2nd “leg” in next ch-2 space] 7 times, ch 1; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—8 dc and 8 ch-1 spaces with **A**.

Round 46: Place **B** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next dc, (ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 space (beg dc2tog made), [ch 1, skip next dc, dc2tog working first “leg” in next dc and 2nd “leg” in next ch-2 space] 7 times, ch 1, bring dropped **A** loop and working yarn to front of piece; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—8 dc and 8 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off **B**, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Round 47: Place **A** loop back on hook, skip first dc, slip st in next ch-1 space, ch 3, bring **B** yarn tail to front of piece, [skip next dc, dc in next ch-1 space] 7 times; join with slip st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off **A**, leaving a long tail for sewing—8 dc.

FINISHING


Weave **A** tail through each **A** dc on Round 47, pull tightly to close. Do not weave in end. Thread **B** tail on yarn needle. [Insert needle from front to back through center hole then from back to front through top of next **B** dc on Round 46 (straight st made)] 16 times—16 straight sts (in 8 pairs) with **B**. Pull **A** tail again to tighten, if needed. Weave in ends.

Join with sc = Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

Notes

1. Skirt is worked back and forth in rows. Hearts are made separately and sewn to each star point section. Half heart is sewn to each half star point.
2. Each section is separated by a 3-dc group.

SKIRT

Upper Section

Beginning at top edge, with **A**, ch 46.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—45 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in next 2 sts, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next 6 sts, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st; repeat from * 3 times, ch 1, skip next st, dc in last 3 sts, turn—30 dc, five 3-dc groups, and 10 ch-1 spaces.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in next 2 sts, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next 6 sts, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st; repeat from * 3 times, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next 2 sts, dc in top of beginning ch, turn—40 dc, five 3-dc groups, and 10 ch-1 spaces.

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in next 3 sts, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next 8 sts, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st; repeat from * 3 times, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next 3 sts, dc in top of beginning ch, turn—50 dc, five 3-dc groups, and 10 ch-1 spaces.

Rows 7–21: Ch 3, dc in each st to next ch-1 space, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in each st to next ch-1 space, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st; repeat from * 3 times, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in each remaining st to beginning ch, dc in top of beginning ch, turn—200 dc, five 3-dc groups, and 10 ch-1 spaces.

Row 22: Ch 3, dc in each st to next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next ch-1 space, skip next st, 3 dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in each st to next ch-1 space, dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, skip next st, 3 dc in next st; repeat from * 3 times, ch 1, skip next st, skip next ch-1 space, dc in each remaining st to beginning ch, dc in top of beginning ch, turn—208 dc, five 3-dc groups, and 10 ch-1 spaces. Do not fasten off.

Lower Section

First Half Star Point

Row 23 (right side): Ch 1, sc in first 20 sts, sc2tog; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—21 sts.

Continued...

Row 24: Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each st, turn—20 sts.

Row 25: Ch 1, sc in each st to last 2 sts, sc2tog, turn—19 sts.

Row 26: Repeat Row 24—18 sts.

Rows 27–40: Repeat Rows 25 and 26 seven times—4 sts.

Row 41: Ch 1, sc in each st, turn.

Row 42: Ch 1, [sc2tog] twice, turn—2 sts.

Row 43: Ch 1, sc in each st, turn.

Row 44: Sc2tog—1 st. Fasten off.

Star Point #1

Row 23: With wrong side facing, join **A** with slip st in last st of next 3-dc group, ch 1, sc2tog over same st as join and next ch-1 space, sc in each st to next ch-1 space, sc2tog; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—44 sts.

Row 24: Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each st to last 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in last st, turn—42 sts.

Row 25: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each st to last 2 sts, sc2tog, turn—40 sts.

Row 26–43: Repeat Rows 24 and 25 nine times—4 sts.

Row 44: Ch 1, [sc2tog] twice, turn—2 sts.

Row 45: Sc2tog—1 st. Fasten off.

Star Point #2, #3, and #4

Work same as star point #1.

Second Half Star Point

Row 23: With wrong side facing, join **A** with slip st in last st of next 3-dc group, ch 1, sc2tog over same st as join and next ch-1 space, sc in each st to next ch-1 space, sc2tog; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—21 sts.

Row 24: Ch 3, dc in each st to last 2 sts, dc2tog, turn—20 sts.

Row 25: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each remaining st, turn—19 sts.

Row 26: Repeat Row 24—18 sts.

Continued...



Rows 27–40: Repeat Rows 25 and 26 seven times—4 sts.

Row 41: Ch 1, sc in each st, turn.

Row 42: Ch 1, [sc2tog] twice, turn—2 sts.

Row 43: Ch 1, sc in each st, turn.

Row 44: Sc2tog, turn—1 st. Do not fasten off.

Edging

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, sc evenly around in each st and across ends of rows, working 3 sc in st at each point and in first and last sts of Row 1. Fasten off.

Border

Row 1 (right side): With right side facing, join **B** with sc in center st of 3-sc group at bottom of second half star point, *ch 3, skip next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * across to 3-sc group at bottom of first half star point, ending with last sc in any st of 3-sc group after last skipped st. Fasten off.

First Half Heart

With **C**, ch 2.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn—1 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in sc, turn—2 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, turn—3 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—4 sc.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 2 sc, turn—5 sc.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—6 sc.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—7 sc.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—8 sc.

Rows 13–15: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in last 6 sc, turn—7 sc.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog, turn—5 sc.

Round 19: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next sc, sc2tog, do not turn; sc evenly around in each st and across ends of rows, working 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch of Row 1; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Second Half Heart

Work same as first half heart Rows 1–18.

Round 19: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn; sc evenly around in each st and across ends of rows, working 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch of Row 1; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Heart (make 4)

With **C**, ch 2.

Row 1: Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn—3 sc.

Row 2 (right side): Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—4 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in last sc, turn—6 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—8 sc.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 7: Repeat Row 5—10 sc.

Rows 8–13: Repeat Rows 5 and 6 three times—16 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

First Arch

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sc; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—8 sc.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in last 6 sc, turn—7 sc.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog, turn—5 sc.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in next sc, sc2tog—3 sc. Fasten off.

Second Arch

Row 15: With wrong side of Row 15 facing, join **C** with sc in next st, sc in remaining sc, turn—8 sc.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sc, sc2tog, turn—7 sc.

Rows 17–19: Repeat Rows 17–19 of first arch, do not fasten off, sc evenly around in each st and across ends of rows, working 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch of Row 1; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

FINISHING

Using photograph as a guide, center hearts on lower sections and pin in place. Position and pin each half heart with straight edge aligned to outer edge of half star point. Sew all pieces in place. Weave in ends.

This lovable character will be a wonderful addition to your holiday decorating! The heart garland and jingle bell collar dress up this deer fella for the festivities.

Reindeer measures 11½" (29 cm) from tip of nose to end of neck.

Special Stitch

sc2tog = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Notes

1. Head, neck, antlers, nose, and ears are worked in continuous rounds (spiral) with right side facing at all times. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.
2. All pieces except chain of hearts and hearts are made with 2 strands of yarn held together.
3. After pieces are assembled, head and neck are glued to plaque. Be sure to use glue that will bond fabric to wood.

REINDEER Head

With larger hook and 2 strands of **A** held together, ch 2.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around—12 sc.

Round 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—18 sc.

Rounds 4–10: Sc in each sc around.

Round 11: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—24 sc.

Round 12: Sc in each sc around.

Round 13: Sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next 6 sc, sc in next 12 sc—30 sc.

Round 14: Sc in each sc around.

Round 15: Sc in next 6 sc, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 12 sc—36 sc.

Rounds 16–22: Sc in each sc around.

Round 23: [Sc in next 4 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—30 sc.

Round 24: [Sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—24 sc.

Round 25: Sc in each sc around.

Round 26: [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—18 sc. Insert stuffing.

Round 27: [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 6 times—12 sc.

Round 28: [Sc2tog] 6 times—6 sc. Add stuffing as needed. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Weave tail through last sts and pull gently but tightly to close.

Large Antler (make 2)

With larger hook and 2 strands of **B** held together, ch 2.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Rounds 2–22: Sc in each sc around. Stuff firmly, bending slightly as you go to shape.

Round 23: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times—9 sc. Fasten off.

Medium Antler (make 2)

With larger hook and 2 strands of **B** held together, ch 2.

Rounds 1–16: Work same as Rounds 1–16 of large antler.

Round 17: Work 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in remaining 4 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Stuff firmly.

Small Antler (make 2)

With larger hook and 2 strands of **B** held together, ch 2.

Rounds 1–11: Work same as Rounds 1–11 of large antler.

Round 12: Work same as Round 17 of medium antler.

Continued...

Ear (make 2)

With larger hook and 2 strands of **A** held together, ch 2.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice—8 sc.

Round 3: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice —10 sc.

Round 4: [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice —12 sc.

Round 5: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—18 sc.

Rounds 6–12: Sc in each sc around.

Round 13: [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 6 times—12 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail or sewing. Do not stuff.

Nose

With larger hook and 2 strands of **C** held together, ch 2.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around—12 sc.

Round 3: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Stuff lightly and sew nose in place.

Neck

With larger hook and 2 strands of **A** held together, ch 30; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1: Sc in each ch around—30 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: Sc in each sc around.

Round 3: Sc in next 5 sc, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 10 times, sc in next 5 sc—40 sc.

Round 4: Sc in each sc around.

Round 5: Sc in next 10 sc, hdc in next 20 sc, sc in next 10 sc.

Round 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rounds 7–10: Repeat Rounds 5 and 6 twice.

Round 11: Working in back loops only, [sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 10 times—30 sc.

Round 12: [Sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog] 6 times—24 sc. Fasten off.

Collar

With larger hook and 2 strands of **D** held together, ch 51.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—50 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Heart (make 6)

With smaller hook and **C**, ch 2.

Row 1 (right side): Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn—3 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn—4 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in last sc—6 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in next sc, 4 dc in next sc, slip st in next 2 sc, 4 dc in next sc, sc in last sc; working across ends of rows down first side, sc in next 3 rows; working in opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in ch; working across ends of rows up other side, sc in next 3 rows; join with slip st in first sc—11 sc and 8 dc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Use photograph as a guide to placement of all pieces.

Head and Neck

Using photo as guide, sew button eyes on head.

Sew medium antler to large antler above Round 20. Sew small antler to large antler above Round 14 so it appears in line

between large and medium antler. Sew each complete antler firmly to sides of head so it stands out without drooping. Fold ear in half at Round 13 and sew through all thicknesses. Sew ears under antlers. Stuff nose lightly and sew in place. Stuff neck. With last round of neck facing, insert head and sew securely to neck. Add stuffing to neck as needed so neck is firm and evenly shaped. Glue first round of neck to plaque and secure with upholstery tacks placed close to edge of round and spaced evenly around. Collar Sew jingle bells evenly spaced around collar. Sew collar around neck at edge of plaque ensuring that tacks are covered. Chain of Hearts

Row 1: With smaller hook and **C**, [ch 15, slip st in first slip st of heart] 6 times, ch 15. Fasten off. Drape chain of hearts in desired arrangement on antlers and tack in place as needed. Weave in remaining ends.

Use these knit ornaments to create a tree with a home-crafted cozy feel. These clever designs are perfect to make and give to those we love!

Each heart ornament measures about 6" (15 cm) wide (at widest) and 5½" (14 cm) tall (at tallest).

Special Stitch

kfb (Knit into front and back) = Knit next st but do not remove from needle, knit into back loop of same st and remove from needle.

Notes

1. Instructions and materials are given for making a set of six heart ornaments. Each ornament is decorated with different knit shapes: Two with layered hearts, two with mittens, and two with birds.
2. Each ornament is made from two large hearts sewn together and stuffed.

LARGE HEARTS

(make 12 - 4 each with A and D, and 2 each with B and C)

Cast on 3 sts.

Row 1 (right side): Knit.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: [Kfb] 3 times—6 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5 (increase row): K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1—8 sts.

Rows 6–21: Repeat last 2 rows 8 more times—24 sts at the end of Row 21.

Rows 22–28: Beginning with a wrong side (purl) row, work in Stockinette st (knit on right side, purl on wrong side) for 7 rows.

First Lobe

Row 29 (right side): K12 for first lobe, place remaining 12 sts on a stitch holder for second lobe.

Work across 12 first lobe stitches only.

Row 30: Purl.

Row 31 (decrease row): K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—10 sts remain.

Rows 32–35: Repeat last 2 rows 2 more times—6 sts remain.

Bind off as if to purl.

Second Lobe

Return the 12 second lobe stitches from holder to needle, ready to work a right side (knit) row.

Row 29 (right side): Knit.

Rows 30–35: Work same as Rows 30–35 of first lobe—6 sts remain.

Bind off as if to purl.

MEDIUM HEARTS

(make 2, 1 each with A and B)

Cast on 3 sts.

Rows 1–3: Work same as Rows 1–3 of large heart—6 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5 (increase row): K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1—8 sts.

Rows 6–15: Repeat last 2 rows 5 more times—18 sts at the end of Row 15.

Rows 16–18: Beginning with a wrong side (purl) row, work in Stockinette st for 3 rows.

First Lobe

Row 19 (right side): K9 for first lobe, place remaining 9 sts on a stitch holder for second lobe.

Work across 9 first lobe stitches only.

Row 20: Purl.

Row 21 (decrease row): K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—7 sts remain.

Rows 22–23: Repeat Rows 20 and 21—5 sts remain.

Row 24: Purl.

Bind off as if to knit.

Second Lobe

Return the 9 second lobe stitches from holder to needle, ready to work a right side (knit) row.

Row 19 (right side): Knit.

Rows 20–24: Work same as Rows 20–24 of first lobe—5 sts remain.

Bind off as if to knit.

Continued...

SMALL HEARTS (make 2)

With **C**, cast on 3 sts.

Rows 1–4: Work same as Rows 1–3 of large heart—6 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5 (increase row): K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1—8 sts.

Rows 6 and 7: Repeat last 2 rows—10 sts.

Rows 8–10: Beginning with a wrong side (purl) row, work in Stockinette st for 3 rows.

First Lobe

Row 11 (right side): K1, k2tog, k2 for first lobe, place remaining 5 sts on a stitch holder for second lobe.

Work across 4 first lobe stitches only.

Row 12: Purl.

Row 13 (decrease row): K1, k2tog, k1—3 sts remain.

Bind off as if to purl.

Second Lobe

Return the 5 second lobe stitches from holder to needle, ready to work a right side (knit) row.

Row 11 (right side): K2, k2tog, k1—4 sts remain.

Rows 12 and 13: Work same as Rows 12 and 13 of first lobe—3 sts remain.

Bind off as if to purl.

MITTEN

(make 2 - 1 each with B and D)

Beginning at cuff edge, cast on 8 sts.

Rows 1–4: [K1, p1] 4 times.

Row 5: K3, [kfb] twice, k3—10 sts.

Row 6: Purl.

Thumb

Row 7 (right side): [Kfb] twice for thumb, place remaining 8 sts on a holder for hand—4 sts remain.

Work across 4 thumb stitches only.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K1, k2tog, k1—3 sts remain.

Row 10: Purl.

Row 11: K3tog—1 st remains. Fasten off.

Hand

Return the 8 hand stitches from holder to needle, ready to work a right side (knit) row.

Row 7 (right side): Kfb, k6, kfb—10 sts.

Rows 8–10: Beginning with a wrong side (purl) row, work in Stockinette st for 3 rows.

Row 11: K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—8 sts remain.

Rows 12 and 13: Repeat last 2 rows—6 sts remain.

Row 14: Purl.

Row 15: K1, [k2tog] twice, k1—4 sts remain. Bind off as if to purl.

BIRD

(make 2 - 1 each with A and C)

Cast on 4 sts.

Row 1: K1, [kfb] twice, k1—6 sts.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: K1, kfb, knit to last 2 sts, kfb, k1—8 sts.

Rows 4 and 5: Repeat Rows 2 and 3—10 sts.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K1, kfb, knit to end of row—11 sts.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: Bind off first 7 sts, knit to end of row—4 sts remain.

Row 10: Purl.

Row 11: K2, k2tog—3 sts remain.

Row 12: Purl.

Row 13: K3tog—1 st remains. Fasten off.

HANGER

(make 6 - 2 each with B and C, 1 each with A and D)

Cast on 40 sts.

Bind off without having knit any rows.

FINISHING

Layered Heart Ornament #1: Sew a **B**-colored medium heart to the center of a **C**-colored large heart, then sew a **D**-colored small heart to the center of the medium heart, adding a small amount of stuffing behind each heart to make it puff out slightly. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and the second **C**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold the **D**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.



Layered Heart Ornament #2: Sew an **A**-colored medium heart to the center of a **B**-colored large heart, then sew a **C**-colored small heart to the center of the medium heart, adding a small amount of stuffing behind each heart to make it puff out slightly. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and the second **B**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold a **C**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.

Mitten Ornament #1: Sew the **B**-colored mitten to the center of an **A**-colored large heart. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and a second **A**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold a **C**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.



Mitten Ornament #2: Sew the **D**-colored mitten to the center of an **A**-colored large heart. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and a second **A**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold an **A**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.



Bird Ornament #1: Sew the **C**-colored bird to the center of a **D**-colored large heart. With small amount of black yarn, embroider a French knot eye and straight stitch legs for the bird. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and a second **D**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold a **B**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.



Bird Ornament #2: Sew the **A**-colored bird to the center of a **D**-colored large heart. With small amount of black yarn, embroider a French knot eye and straight stitch legs for the bird. This makes the front of the ornament. With wrong sides together, sew the front and a second **D**-colored large heart together, stuffing before closing. Fold a **B**-colored hanger in half and sew ends to top center of ornament. Weave in ends.

A, B, C = Color A, Color B, Color C etc; **k** = knit; **k2tog** = knit next 2 stitches together; **k3tog** = knit next 3 stitches together; **p** = purl; **st(s)** = stitch (es); **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.



Pillow Cover fits a 16 x 16" (40.5 x 40.5 cm) pillow form

Special Stitch

dc2tog = [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up loop, yarn over, draw through 2 loops] 2 times, yarn over, draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Stripe Sequence #1

Work 1 row with A, 1 row with B, 1 row with A, 4 rows with C, 1 row with A, 1 row with B, 1 row with A, 6 rows with E, 1 row with A, 1 row with B, 1 row with A, 4 rows with D, 1 row with A, 1 row with B, 1 row with A.

Stripe Sequence #2

Work 4 rows with D, 4 rows with E, 3 rows with C, 1 row with A, 2 rows with B, 1 row with A, 3 rows with C, 4 rows with E, 4 rows D.

Notes

1. Each Pillow Cover is made in a single piece. The straight edges of the piece are sewn together to form a tube. The rippled edges at one end are then matched and sewn together. The pillow form is inserted and the rippled edges at the bottom matched and sewn together.
2. To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

PILLOW #1

With A, ch 99 loosely.

Row 1 (right side): Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), dc in next 5 ch, [dc2tog] twice, dc in next 5 ch, *2 dc in each of next 2 ch, dc in next 5 ch, [dc2tog] twice, dc in next 5 ch; repeat from * to last ch, 2 dc in last ch, turn—6 ripples. Change to B.

Row 2: With B, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in first dc, dc in next 5 dc, [dc2tog] twice, dc in next 5 dc, *2 dc in each of next 2 dc, dc in next 5 dc, [dc2tog] twice, dc in next 5 dc; repeat from * to turning ch, 2 dc in top of turning ch, turn. Change to A. Repeat Row 2 and continue to change color as in Stripe Sequence #1, until all 26 rows are worked. Fasten off.

PILLOW #2

Work same as Pillow #1, changing color as in Stripe Sequence #2.


FINISHING

With matching color yarn, sew straight side edges of the piece together to form a tube. Flatten the tube, with seam at one side edge. Slide the seam over until the peaks on the top layer line up with the valleys of the lower layer. Sew the top rippled edge closed. Insert the pillow form. Sew the lower rippled edge closed. Weave in ends.

Tip: If you want the Cover to be removable, sew the straight edges together for only about 1" (2.5 cm) at beginning and at end of edge, leaving about 14" (35.5 cm) unsewn in the middle. Sew in a 14" (35.5 cm) zipper.

Look like you just stepped out of a cinematic film in this fetching crocheted top hat! Deck it out with crocheted flowers, sequins and netting as we did, or let your creativity go as wild as you please.

Throw measures 50 x 70" (127 x 178 cm)

Pillow measures 12 x 12" (30.5 x 30.5 cm)

Special Stitches

picot = Ch 3, slip st in 3rd ch from hook.

reverse sc (reverse single crochet) =

Work single crochet in opposite direction from which you would usually work (left to right if you are right-handed, and right to left if you are left-handed). This stitch is also known as crab stitch. It creates a rope-like twisted single crochet ridge.

Notes

1. Throw is made from 20 Squares. Squares are arranged as shown in assembly diagram and crocheted together.
2. Pillow is made from 2 Squares.

THROW

SQUARE (make 20)

With larger hook and **A**, ch 36.

Row 1 (wrong side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn—35 sc.

Low Front Ridge

Note: Both rows of the Low Front Ridge are worked into the stitches of the previous row. The first row (Row 2) is worked into the front loops only. The piece is then turned and the next row (Row 3) is worked into the free loops of the same row (the free loops are in the front after the piece is turned).

Row 2 (right side): Ch 1, working in front loops only, skip the first sc, slip st in next sc and in each sc across, slip st in turning ch, turn—35 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in the free loops of sts in same row as Row 2 was worked, do not skip first sc, sc in each sc across (do not work in the turning ch), turn—35 sc.

Cable Pattern

Row 4 (right side): Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 3, skip next 2 sc of previous row (Row 3), sc in next sc, TURN, work sc in each ch of the ch-3 just made, slip st in the sc that was made just before the ch-3 was made (cable made), TURN; working behind the cable, sc in each of the skipped sc; repeat from * across to last sc, sc in last sc, turn—11 cables.

Note: In the next row, you will work a sc in the first and last sc, and 3 sc evenly spaced behind each cable (on wrong side). The 3 sc behind each cable are worked into the stitches that were worked into the 2 skipped sc. Work 2 sc in the first of these stitches and 1 sc in the other. Do not work into the sc of the cables. Push the cables towards the right side of the Throw as you work.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *working in the 2 sts "behind" the next cable, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st; repeat from * across to last st, sc in last st, turn—35 sc.

Low Front Ridge

Rows 6 and 7: Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, do NOT turn.

Reverse Single Crochet Ridge

Note: Both rows of the Reverse Single Crochet Ridge are worked into the stitches of the previous row. The first row (Row 9) is worked into the front loops only. The next row (Row 10) is worked into the free loops of the same row

Row 9: Working in front loops only, ch 1, skip the first sc, reverse sc in each sc across, slip st in turning ch, do NOT turn.

Row 10: Working in remaining back loops of Row 8, sc in first sc and each sc across, turn.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Continued...

Low Front Ridge

Rows 12 and 13: Work same as Rows 2 and 3.

Cable Pattern

Rows 14 and 15: Work same as Rows 4 and 5.

Low Front Ridge

Rows 16 and 17: Work same as Rows 2 and 3.

Shadow Box

Row 18: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), dc in first 4 sts, *skip next 2 sts, tr in next 2 sts, working behind the last 2 sts made, tr in each of the 2 skipped sts, skip next 2 sts, tr in next 2 sts, working in front of the last 2 sts made, tr in each of the 2 skipped sts, dc in next 2 sts; repeat from * 2 more times, dc in last st, turn.

Row 19: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), dc in first 3 sts, *skip next 2 sts, tr in next 2 sts, working behind the last 2 sts made, tr in each of the 2 skipped sts, skip next 2 sts, tr in next 2 sts, working in front of the last 2 sts made, tr in each of the 2 skipped sts, dc in next 2 sts; repeat from * 2 more times, dc in last 2 sts, turn.

Rows 20 and 21: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 22–37: Repeat Rows 2–17. Do not fasten off.

Square Border

Change to smaller hook.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, (sc, ch 1, sc) in first sc (first corner made), sc in each st across to last st, (sc, ch 1, sc) in last st (corner made); working in ends of rows, work 33 sc evenly spaced across side edge; working across opposite side of foundation ch, (sc, ch 1, sc) in first ch (corner made), sc in next 33 ch, (sc, ch 1, sc) in last ch (corner made); working in ends of rows, work 33 sc evenly

spaced across side edge; join with slip st in first sc—140 sc (35 sc across each side of square) and 4 corner ch-1 spaces. Fasten off.

Assembly

Arrange Squares as shown in Assembly Diagram. Crochet edges of five Squares together to make a strip, crocheting neighboring edges of Squares together as follows.

1. Hold 2 Squares with wrong sides together (right sides facing out) and stitches of edge to be joined matching.
2. With smaller hook and working through both thicknesses, draw up a loop of yarn in corner at beginning of edge to be joined, work reverse sc all the way across edge to join Squares. Fasten off.
3. Repeat to make 4 strips. Crochet long edges of strips together in same manner to form Throw.

Throw Border

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing and smaller hook, join yarn with sc in a corner ch-1 space to work across a short edge, sc in each sc and join between Squares across short edge, (sc, ch 1, sc) in corner ch-1 space, sc in each sc and join between Squares across long edge, (sc, ch 1, sc) in corner ch-1 space, sc in each sc and join between Squares across next short edge, (sc, ch 1, sc) in corner ch-1 space, sc in each sc and join between Squares across next long edge, sc in same corner ch-1 space as first sc, ch 1; join with slip st in first sc, do NOT turn—652 sc (145 sc across each short edge, and 181 sc across each long edge) and 4 corner ch-1 spaces.

Round 2: Ch 1, reverse sc in each sc across long edge to corner ch-1 space, TURN (so wrong side is facing), slip st in corner ch-1 space, ch 1, sc in each sc across short edge to next corner ch-1 space, sc in corner ch-1

space, ch 1, TURN (so right side is facing), reverse sc in each sc across next long edge to next corner ch-1 space, TURN (so wrong side is facing), slip st in corner ch-1 space, ch 1, sc in each sc across short edge to beginning ch-1, sc in beginning ch-1, turn—656 sc (146 sc across each short edge and 182 sc across each long edge). Do not fasten off.

Cable Lace Trim

Row 1 (right side): Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), skip first sc, dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st; repeat from * across short edge, turn; leave remaining sts unworked—74 dc and 73 ch-1 spaces.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch-1 space across, turn—147 sc.

Low Front Ridge

Row 3: Ch 1, working in front loops only, skip the first sc, slip st in next sc and in each sc across, slip st in turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, working in the free loops of sts in same row as Row 3 were worked, do not skip first sc, sc in each sc across (do not work in the turning ch), turn.

Cable Pattern

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, *ch 3, skip next 2 sc of Row 4, sc in next sc, TURN, work sc in each ch of the ch-3 just made, slip st in the sc that was made just before the ch-3 was made (cable made), TURN; working behind the cable, sc in each of the skipped sc; repeat from * across to last sc, sc in last sc, sc in turning ch, turn—48 cables.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, *working in the 2 sts “behind” the cable, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st; repeat from * across, sc in last st, sc in turning ch, turn—148 sc.

Low Front Ridge

Row 7: Ch 1, working in front loops only, skip the first sc, slip st in next sc and in each sc across, slip st in turning ch, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, working in the free loops of sts in same row as Row 7 were worked, do not skip first sc, sc in each sc across (do not work in the turning ch), turn. Dc-Mesh

Row 9: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), skip first st, dc in next st, *ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st; repeat from * across, turn—75 dc and 74 ch-1 spaces.

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first dc, sc in next ch-1 space, sc in next dc, *skip next ch-1 space, skip next dc, skip next ch-1 space, (4 tr, picot, 4 tr) in next dc, skip next ch-1 space, skip next dc, skip next ch-1 space, sc in next dc; repeat from * across to turning ch-space, sc in turning ch-space, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch—18 (4 tr, picot, 4 tr) groups. Fasten off.

FINISHING THROW

Weave in any remaining ends.

PILLOW

(make 3 – 1 each with A, B, and C)

SQUARES


(make 2 for each pillow)

Make same as Squares for Throw, including Border.

Continued...

SLIP COVER (optional)

Note: Because color of pillow will show through the stitches in the center, designer recommends sewing a simple slip cover in a similar color for the pillow form before covering with the crocheted squares. Cut 2 pieces of fabric, 12½ x 12½" (32 x 32 cm). Hold the pieces with right sides together. Leaving a ¼" (6 mm) seam allowance, sew 3 sides of fabric squares together. Turn the piece right side out, insert pillow form. Pin the 4th side closed, tucking ¼" (6 mm) seam allowance to the inside and sew closed.



FINISHING PILLOW

Hold the 2 crocheted Squares with wrong sides together (right sides facing outward). With smaller hook, matching yarn color, and working through both thicknesses, draw up a loop of yarn in any corner, ch 1, work reverse sc all the way across 3 sides to join Squares. Insert pillow form and crochet last side closed, join with slip st in beginning ch-1. Fasten off. Weave in any remaining ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B, and C = Color **A**, Color **B**, and Color **C**;
ch = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch (es); **tr** = treble (triple) crochet; **()** = work directions in parentheses into same st; ***** = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.

Row 1 (right side): Dc in 4th ch from hook, *dc in each of next 5 ch, [dc2tog over next 2 ch] twice, dc in each of the next 5 ch, 2 dc in next ch**, 2 dc in next ch; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **; turn – 10 repeats. Fasten off **A**, join **B**.

Row 2: With **B**, ch 3, dc in first st, *dc in each of the next 5 sts, [dc2tog over next 2 sts] twice, dc in each of the next 5 sts, 2 dc in next st**, 2 dc in next st; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, turn. Fasten off **B**, join **A**.

Row 3: With **A**, repeat Row 2.
Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Work last st of first color until 2 loops remain on hook, yarn over with 2nd color, draw through 2 loops on hook, drop first color and carry along tops of sts until needed again.

Special Abbreviations

popcorn: 4 sc in next st, drop loop from hook, insert hook from front to back in first sc, pick up dropped loop, draw through loop on hook.

picot: Ch 3, sl st in top of last dc made.

GARLAND (make 2)

With **A**, ch 122.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, *skip next 2 ch, (3 dc, picot, 3 dc) in next ch, skip next 2 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from * across, ending with 2 sc in last ch, do not turn – 20 shells.

Row 2: Working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 2 ch, complete last sc with **B**, drop **A** and carry across tops of sts and work over strand with **B**, *with **B**, work popcorn in next ch, yarn over with **A** and draw through (to complete a ch and change color), drop **B** and carry along tops of sts and work over strand with **A****, sc in each of next 4 ch, complete last sc with **B**, drop **A** and carry across tops of sts and work over strand with **B**, skip next ch; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, sc in each of last 3 ch – 20 popcorns. Fasten off.

Row 3: With right side facing, join **A** with a slip st in first sc of Row 2, ch 1, sc in first sc, *skip next 2 sc, (3 dc, picot, 3 dc) in top of next popcorn**, skip next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **, skip next 2 sc, sc in last sc. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B = color A, B; **ch** = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **()** = work directions in parentheses into same st; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; *** or **** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.

Snowflake Garland

Crochet a garland of snowflakes and transform your home into a winter wonderland! Clear faceted beads add a festive sparkle to this beautiful holiday decoration.

Garland measures 55" (140 cm) long x 5" (12.5 cm) wide.

NOTE

With sewing needle, string 24 beads onto heavy duty thread. Set aside.

Special Abbreviations

ch-4 picot: Ch 4, slip st in 4th ch from hook.

ch-6 picot: Ch 6, slip st in 6th ch from hook.

trefoil: Ch-4 picot, ch-6 picot, ch-4 picot, slip st in base of first picot.

beaded chain (bch): Slide bead up to hook, yarn over, draw yarn through loop on hook.

LARGE SNOWFLAKE (make 6)

With **A**, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in ring; join with a slip st in first sc – 6 sc.

Round 2: Ch 1, (2 sc, ch 2) in each sc around; join with a slip st in first sc – 12 sc; 12 ch-2 spaces.

Round 3: Slip st in next sc and next ch-2 space, ch 1, (sc, ch 3) in each ch-2 space around; join with a slip st in first sc – 12 ch-3 spaces.

Round 4: *Ch 7, skip next ch-3 space, slip st in next sc; repeat from * around – 6 ch-7 spaces.

Round 5: (4 sc, work trefoil, 4 sc) in each ch-7 loop around; join with a slip st in first sc – 6 trefoils. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

SMALL SNOWFLAKE (make 7)

With **A**, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (right side): Work 6 sc in ring; join with a slip st in first sc – 6 sc.

Round 2: Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in same st, ch 2, (2 hdc, ch 2) in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-2 – 12 hdc; 6 ch-2 spaces.

Round 3: Slip st in next hdc, *(slip st, work trefoil, slip st) in next ch-2 ch-2 space, slip st in next hdc; repeat from * around – 6 trefoils. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

GARLAND

With **A** and string of beads held together as one throughout, ch 8, join with slip st in first ch to form a hanging loop, ch 6, slip st in the tip of one trefoil of any Small Snowflake, *ch 15, working 2 bch randomly placed within ch-15 section, slip st in the tip of one trefoil of any Large Snowflake, ch 15, working 2 bch randomly placed within ch-15 section, slip st in the tip of one trefoil of any Small Snowflake; repeat from * until all Snowflakes have been joined to Garland, ch 14, slip st in 8th ch from hook to form a hanging loop. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

FINISHING

With right sides of Snowflakes facing up, join all Snowflakes together at corresponding first picots below each join to Garland as follows: *With sewing needle and heavy duty thread, attach thread to picot on first Snowflake, string bead onto thread, sew to corresponding picot on 2nd Snowflake. Repeat from * across length of Garland, joining all Snowflakes together. Sew one bead to the bottom picot of each Snowflake. Weave in ends.

To keep Large Snowflakes flat, use chenille stems or pipe cleaners. Working from back, insert chenille stem through one ch-6 picot of Large Snowflake and fold end of stem down to secure. Stretch stem across to the opposite point and insert through ch-6 picot, fold down to secure. Trim excess wire. One wire should be sufficient to hold the flake flat. Repeat for other Large Snowflakes.

A, B = color A, B; **ch** = chain; **hdc** = half double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **()** = work directions in parentheses into same st; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; * **or** ** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.

Runner measures 15" wide x 60" long (38 x 152.5 cm).

Special Stitch

Picot = ch 4, slip st in last sc made.

Special Technique

Adjustable-ring method = Wrap yarn into a ring, ensuring that the tail falls behind the working yarn. Grip ring and tail firmly between middle finger and thumb. Insert hook through center of ring, yarn over (with working yarn) and draw up a loop. Work stitches of first round in the ring, working over both strands (the tail and the ring). After the first round of stitches is worked, pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Notes

1. Runner is made from 28 snowflake motifs arranged into 3 rows of 9, 10, and 9 motifs each.
2. Each motif is worked in joined rounds with right side facing at all times.
3. Motifs are sewn to neighboring motifs through center picots in the last rounds. Hold the motifs with wrong sides together as you sew through ch-4 spaces.
4. Make and join motifs to neighboring motifs according to Assembly Diagram and instructions.

RUNNER

Motif (make 28 – 9 with **A**, 9 with **B**, 6 with **C**, and 4 with **D**)
Make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 4 (counts as first dc, ch 1), dc in ring, *(ch 1, dc) in ring; repeat from * 9 times, ch 1; join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch—12 dc and 12 ch-1 spaces. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Round 2: Slip st in first ch-1 space, sc in same space, ch 8, sc in next ch-1 space, sc in next dc, *sc in next ch-1 space, ch 8, sc in next ch-1 space, sc in next dc; repeat from * 4 times; join with slip st in first sc—18 sc and 6 ch-8 spaces.

Round 3: Work ([4 sc, picot] 3 times, 4 sc) in first ch-8 space (spoke made), skip next sc, slip st in next 2 sc, *([4 sc, picot] 3 times, 4 sc) in next ch-8 space, skip next sc, slip st in next 2 sc; repeat from * 4 times; join with slip st in first sc—6 spokes. Fasten off.

FINISHING


With right sides facing, arrange motifs as shown in the assembly diagram. With wrong sides of neighboring spokes held together and matching center picots, sew through ch-4 spaces of center picots to join, matching yarn to one or the other color. Weave in ends. Wet block runner by stretching spokes of each motif evenly, pin in place, and spray with water. Allow to dry thoroughly before handling.

A, B, C = Color A, Color B, Color C, etc.;

**Directions are for size Small. Changes for
sizes Medium and Large are in parentheses.**

Hat measures 16 (18, 20)" [40.5 (45.5,
51) cm] circumference at brim.

Special Technique

Adjustable-ring method = Wrap yarn in
a ring, ensuring that the tail falls behind
the working yarn. Grip ring and tail firmly
between middle finger and thumb. Insert
hook through center of ring, yarn over (with
working yarn) and draw up a loop. Work
stitches of first round in the ring, working
over both strands (the tail and the ring). After
the first round of stitches is worked, pull
gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.
Join with sc = Place a slip knot on hook,
insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn
over and draw up a loop, yarn over and
draw through both loops on hook.

Notes

1. Hat is made in joined rounds with
earflaps worked back and forth in rows.
2. Panda's facial features are made
separately and sewn to front of hat.
3. Chain 1 at the beginning of a round

HAT

With **A**, make an adjustable ring, ch 1.

Round 1 (right side): Work 12 hdc in
ring; join with slip st in first st—12 hdc. Pull
gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Round 2: Ch 1, 2 hdc in each st around;
join with slip st in first st—24 hdc.

Round 3: Ch 1, dc in first st, 2 dc in
next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 11
times; join with slip st in first st—36 dc.

Round 4: Ch 1, dc in first 2 sts, 2 dc in
next st, [dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] 11
times; join with slip st in first st—48 dc.

Round 5: Ch 1, dc in first 7 (3, 3) sts, 2
dc in next st, [dc in next 7 (3, 3) sts, 2
dc in next st] 5 (11, 11) times; join with
slip st in first st—54 (60, 60) dc.

Sizes Small and Medium only

Rounds 6–10 (11): Ch 1, dc in each st
around; change to **B**; join with slip st in first st.

Rounds 11 (12) and 12 (13): Ch 1, dc in
each st around; join with slip st in first st.
Do not fasten off.

Size Large only

Round 6: Ch 1, dc in first 9 sts, 2 dc in
next st, [dc in next 9 sts, 2 dc in next st] 5
times; join with slip st in first st—66 dc.

Rounds 7–12: Ch 1, dc in each st around;
change to **B**; join with slip st in first st.

Rounds 13 and 14: Ch 1, dc in each
st around; join with slip st in first st.
Do not fasten off.

Right Earflap

Row 1: Ch 2 (counts as first dc here and
throughout), skip next st, dc in next
5 sts, skip next st, dc in next st; leave
remaining sts unworked, turn—7 dc.

Row 2: Ch 2, skip next st, dc in next 3 sts,
skip next st, dc in last st, turn—5 dc.

Row 3: Ch 2, skip next st, dc in next st, skip
next st, dc in last st, turn—3 dc. Fasten off.

With right side of right earflap facing
and back seam to the right, count
to the left from earflap and place
marker on 25th (29th, 33rd) st.

Left Earflap

With right side facing, join **B** with slip st in
marked st and work same as right earflap.

Continued...

Edging

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing, join **B** with sc in any st at center back between earflaps, sc in each st around and working 3 sc in end of each row; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Ears (make 2)

With **B**, make an adjustable ring, ch 1.

Round 1 (right side): Work 10 hdc in ring; join with slip st in first st—10 hdc. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Round 2: Ch 1, hdc in first st, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] 4 times; join with slip st in first st—15 hdc.

Round 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st around; join with slip st in first st.

Round 4: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with slip st in first st—15 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

With front facing, flatten hat and place stitch markers at Rounds 2 and 4 on each side of hat. Flatten each ear and sew between markers.

Nose

With **B**, make an adjustable ring, ch 1.

Round 1: Work 10 hdc in ring; join with slip st in first st—10 hdc. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

With front of hat facing and using photograph as a guide for placement, center nose where desired in **A**-colored section and sew in place.

Eyes (make 2)

With **B**, ch 7.

Round 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 ch, 5 hdc in last ch; working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in first 5 ch, 2 sc in last ch, join with slip st in first st—17 sts.

Round 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next 5 sts, sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in last 2 sts, join with slip st in first st—25 sts. Fasten off.

With front of hat facing and using photograph as a guide for placement, position eyes on either side of nose, turning one piece to opposite side, and sew in place. Sew buttons to eyes with a strand of **B** if contrast stitching is desired.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Braids (make 2)

Cut nine 28" (71 cm) strands of **B**. Separate into 3 hanks of 3 strands each. Thread each hank through last row of earflap and fold over so strands are doubled. Braid doubled hanks until 4" (10 cm) of strands remain, tie an overhand knot tightly, and trim ends evenly.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B = Color A, Color B; **ch** = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **hdc** = half double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.

Directions are for size 3 months; changes for sizes 6, 12, 18 and 24 months are in parentheses.

Finished Chest: 18 (20, 22, 24, 26)" [45.5 (51, 56, 61, 66) cm]

Finished Length: 9 (10½, 12, 13½, 15)" [23 (26.5, 30.5, 34, 38) cm]

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

M1 = Make 1 (Inc) – Lift strand between needles to left-hand needle and work strand through the back loop, twisting it to prevent a hole, [knit or purl as indicated by pattern st].

3-Needle Bind-off (seaming 2 pieces together as you bind off) Place stitches of pieces to be joined on separate needles or each end of a circular needle, hold one behind the other with right sides facing each other in left hand; with a third needle the same size, k2tog (1 from one needle and 1 from the other) - 1 st on right-hand needle, *ktog, in same manner, bind off; repeat from *.

dec = On right side rows, work ssk at beginning and k2tog at end of rows. On wrong side rows, work p2tog at beginning and ssp at end of rows.

Notes

Sweater is worked flat in one piece to the underarm, then divided for fronts and back upper body.

LOWER BODY

With larger needles and **B**, cast on 54 (60, 66, 72, 78) sts. Knit 6 rows, cut **B**. Continue with smaller needles and **A**. **Increase row (Right Side):** *K1, m1, k2; repeat from * to end—72 (80, 88, 96, 104) sts. Work even in St st until piece measures 5 (6, 7, 8, 9)" [12.5 (15, 18, 20.5, 23) cm], end on wrong side row.

Divide for Front and Back

K18 (20, 22, 24, 26), place sts on holder for right front. Place last 18 (20, 22, 24, 26) sts on holder for left front.

BACK

Continue on center 36 (40, 44, 48, 52) sts in St st for 4 (4½, 5, 5½, 6)" [10 (11.5, 12.5, 14, 15) cm], end with a wrong side row.

Next row (Right Side): K8 (10, 12, 14, 16) shoulder sts, place on holder; bind off 20 sts for back neck; k8 (10, 12, 14, 16) shoulder sts, place on holder.

FRONTS

Left Front

Place sts for left front on needle; join **A**. Beginning with a right side row, work in St st for 2 (2½, 3, 3½, 4)" [5 (6.5, 7.5, 9, 10) cm], end on a right side row.

Next row (Wrong Side): Bind off 5 st, work to end of row.

Dec 1 st at neck edge every right side row 5 times—8 (10, 12, 14, 16) sts. Work even until front measures same as back to shoulder. Place sts on holder.

Right Front

Place sts for right front on needle; join **A**. Beginning with a right side row, work in St st for 2 (2½, 3, 3½, 4)" [5 (6.5, 7.5, 9, 10) cm], end with a wrong side row.

Next row (Right Side): Bind off 5 sts, work to end of row.

Dec 1 st at neck edge every right side row 5 times—8 (10, 12, 14, 16) sts. Work even until front measures same as back to shoulder. Place sts on holder.

SLEEVES

With larger needles and **B**, cast on 15 (18, 18, 21, 21) sts. Knit 6 rows, cut **B**. Continue with smaller needles and **A**.

Continued...

Increase row (Right Side): *K1, m1, k2; repeat from * to end—20 (24, 24, 28, 28) sts. Continuing in St st, inc 1 st each side every 4 rows 6 (6, 8, 8, 10) times—32 (36, 40, 44, 48) sts. Work even until sleeve measures 6 (7, 8, 9, 10)" [15 (18, 20.5, 23, 25.5) cm]. Bind off. Repeat for other sleeve.

HOOD

With smaller needles and **A**, cast on 56 (64, 72, 72, 72) sts. Work in St st until hood measures 6 (7, 8, 8, 8)" [15 (18, 20.5, 20.5, 20.5) cm]. Slip half the sts to spare needle; fold hood in half with right sides together. Join 3-needle bind-off.

FINISHING

Block pieces. Place front and back sts of left shoulder on separate smaller needles; hold with right sides together, join with 3-needle bind-off. Repeat for right shoulder. Sew sleeve seam; sew sleeve into armhole. Pin center hood seam to center of back neck; pin front edge of hood to front edge of sweater. Pin hood edge to neckline, folding a pleat with extra hood fabric between center back neck and shoulder seams on each side. Sew hood in place.

Front Band

With larger needles, **B**, and beginning at bottom of right front, pick up and knit 21 (24, 30, 36, 38) sts along right front, 42 (48, 54, 54, 54) sts around hood, 21 (24, 30, 36, 38) sts along left front—84 (96, 114, 126, 130) sts. Knit 1 row.

Buttonhole row (Right Side): K2 (2, 2, 2, 3), [k2tog, yo, k3 (4, 4, 4, 4) sts] 3 (3, 4, 5, 5) times, k2tog, yo, k2 (2, 2, 2, 3); knit to end of row. Knit 3 rows. Bind off.

Sew buttons on left front opposite buttonholes.

Weave in ends.

With **B**, make 3" (7.5 cm) pompom; sew to point of hood.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B = Color A and B; **k** = knit; **p** = purl; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **St st** = Stockinette stitch; **inc** = increase 1 st; **mm** = millimetres; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; ***** = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.

This doll is ready to celebrate in her party dress, furry shrug, evening bag and dress shoes. Crochet all the pieces and put a smile on any doll lover's face.

Clothes designed for 18" (45.5 cm) doll.

Dress measures 12" circumference around bodice x 11" long (30.5 x 28 cm).

Shrug measures: 15" across sleeves x 7" long (38 x 18 cm).

Shoe measures: 3½" (9 cm) long.

Purse measures: 2½" long by 3" wide (6.5 x 7.5 cm), closed and not including strap.

Special Stitches

sc2tog = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Special Technique

Join with sc: Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

Notes

1. Doll set consists of dress, shrug, shoes, and purse.
2. Top of dress is made in rows and joined rounds; skirt is worked in joined rounds.
3. Shrug begins in continuous rounds to form first sleeve, body is worked in turned rows, and then second sleeve is worked in continuous rounds. You may find it helpful to place a stitch marker for beginning of round and move it up as each round is completed.

DRESS

Note: Work all sections of dress with medium hook.

Bodice

Working from lower edge up, with **A**, ch 44; join with slip st in first ch.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, sc in each ch around; join with slip st in first sc, turn—44 sc.

Rounds 2–8: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc, turn.

Right Back

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first 10 sc; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—10 sc.

Row 10–15: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Right Back Shoulder

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sc; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—5 sc.

Row 17–20: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Fasten off.

Front

Row 9 (right side): With right side facing, skip next 2 sc of Row 8, join **A** with sc in next st, sc in each remaining sc, turn—20 sc.

Rows 10–13: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Left Front Shoulder

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sc; leave remaining sts unworked, turn—5 sc.

Rows 15–20: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Fasten off.

Right Front Shoulder

Row 14: With wrong side facing, skip next 10 sc of Row 8, join **A** with sc in next st, sc in remaining 4 sc, turn—5 sc.

Rows 15–20: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Fasten off.

Left Back Shoulder

Row 9: With right side facing, skip next 2 sc of Row 8, join **A** with sc in next st, sc in each remaining sc, turn—10 sc.

Rows 10–15: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Fasten off.

Row 16: With wrong side facing, skip next 5 sc of Row 15, join **A** with sc in next st, sc in each remaining sc, turn—5 sc.

Row 17–20: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn. Fasten off.

Sew front to back at shoulders.

Continued...

Neck Edging

Row 1: With right side of left back facing, join **A** with sc in first sc of Row 15, ch 6, slip st in 5th ch from hook (button loop made); working in each remaining st and across ends of rows, sc 44 sts evenly around. Fasten off.

Armhole Edging (work 2)

Round 1: With right side of bodice facing, join **A** with sc in any sc in Row 8; working in each remaining st and across ends of rows, sc 28 sts evenly around. Fasten off.

Skirt

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing and working across opposite side of foundation ch of bodice, join **B** with sc in first ch, sc in each remaining ch; join with slip st in first sc, turn—44 sc.

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in first sc, 2 dc in each sc around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch, turn—88 dc.

Rounds 3–12: Ch 3, dc in each dc around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 13: Ch 1, (sc, ch 4) in each dc across; join with slip st in first sc—88 sc and 88 ch-4 spaces. Fasten off.

SHRUG

Note: Sleeves are worked in continuous rounds and body is worked back and forth in rows.

First Sleeve

With largest hook and **C**, ch 14; join with slip st in first ch.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, sc in each ch around—14 sc. Do not join or turn. Optional: Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: Sc in each sc around. Repeat Round 2 until piece measures 3½" (9 cm), turn.

Body

Next Row (right side): Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Repeat last row until piece measures 10" (25.5 cm) from beginning edge.

Second Sleeve

Next Round: With same side as first sleeve facing, sc in each sc around. Do not join or turn. Optional: Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed. Repeat last round until piece measures 13½" (34.5 cm) from beginning edge. Fasten off.

Edging

Round 1: With right side facing of body facing, join **C** with sc in end of first row, sc in same row, working 2 sc in each st or in end of each row, sc 62 sts around body and sleeve edges; join with slip st in first sc, turn—64 sc.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

PURSE

With medium hook and **A**, ch 21.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 18 ch, 3 sc in last ch; working on opposite side of foundation ch, skip first ch, sc in next 19 ch, turn—41 sc. Do not join.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first 20 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in last 20 sc, turn—43 sc.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 21 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in last 21 sc, turn—45 sc.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 22 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in last 22 sc, turn—47 sc.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first 23 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in last 23 sc, turn—49 sc.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first 24 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in last 24 sc—51 sc. Do not turn.

Last Row (strap): Ch 51, slip st in first sc of last row; Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Bring bottom edge with strap to 13th st from beginning edge and sew side edges together.

SHOES (make 2)

With smallest hook and **C**, ch 9.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 6 ch; working on opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in next 6 ch; join with slip st in first sc—18 sc. Optional: Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in same st as join, 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next 3 sc, sc in last 6 sc; join with slip st in first sc—24 sc.

Round 3: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, 2 sc in next sc, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice, sc in next 6 sc, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times, sc in next 6 sc; join with slip st in first sc—30 sc.

Rounds 4 and 5: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc.

Round 6: Ch 1, sc in first 16 sc, [sc2tog] 4 times, sc in remaining 6 sc; join with slip st in first sc—26 sc.

Round 7: Ch 1, sc in first 14 sc, [sc2tog] 4 times, sc in remaining 4 sc; join with slip st in first sc—22 sc.

Round 8: Ch 1, sc in first 13 sc, ch 6 (shoe strap made), skip next 7 sc, sc in last 2 sc; join with slip st in first sc—22 sc and 1 strap). Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew button near top edge of right back with sewing thread.

Tie ribbon around waist and trim ends as desired.

Weave in ends.

Snowy Day Earflap Hat

This darling hat is perfect for keeping warm in the winter! We've included five sizes so you can crochet it to fit any child perfectly.

Directions are for size X-Small. Changes for sizes Small, Medium, Large, and X-Large are in parentheses.

Hat measures 14 (15½, 17, 18½, 20)" [35.5 (39.5, 43, 47, 51) cm] circumference at brim.

Special Technique

Adjustable-ring method = Wrap yarn in a ring, ensuring that the tail falls behind the working yarn. Grip ring and tail firmly between middle finger and thumb. Insert hook through center of ring, yarn over (with working yarn) and draw up a loop. Work stitches of first round in the ring, working over both strands (the tail and the ring). After the first round of stitches is worked, pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.
Join with sc = Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

Color Sequence

At the end of each round, change color as in the following sequence: Work 1 round with **A**, 1 round with **B**, 1 round with **C**, 1 round with **D**.

Notes

1. Hat is made in joined rounds with earflaps worked back and forth in rows.
2. Chain 1 at the beginning of a round or row does not count as a stitch.
3. In rounds only, change color in each size according to color sequence until otherwise instructed.
4. To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color. Cut old color.

HAT

With **A**, make an adjustable ring, ch 1.

Round 1 (right side): Work 10 hdc in ring; change to **B**; join with slip st in first st—10 hdc. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Round 2: Ch 1, 2 hdc in each st around; change to **C**; join with slip st in first st—20 hdc.

Round 3: Ch 1, hdc in first st, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] 9 times; change to **D**; join with slip st in first st—30 hdc.

Round 4: Ch 1, hdc in first 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st] 9 times; change to **A**; join with slip st in first st—40 hdc.

Round 5: Ch 1, hdc in first 7 (3, 3, 3, 3) sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 7 (3, 3, 3, 3) sts, 2 hdc in next st] 4 (9, 9, 9, 9) times; change to **B**; join with slip st in first st—45 (50, 50, 50, 50) hdc.

Continue changing colors as in color sequence until otherwise instructed.

Sizes X-Small and Small only:

Rounds 6–13 (14): Ch 1, hdc in each st around; change to **D** at end of last round; join with slip st in first st. Do not fasten off.

Size Medium only:

Round 6: Ch 1, hdc in first 9 sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 9 sts, 2 hdc in next st] 4 times; join with slip st in first st—55 hdc.

Rounds 7–15: Ch 1, hdc in each st around; join with slip st in first st. Do not fasten off.

Size Large only:

Round 6: Ch 1, hdc in first 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st] 9 times; join with slip st in first st—60 hdc.

Rounds 7–16: Ch 1, hdc in each st around; change to **D** at end of last round; join with slip st in first st. Do not fasten off.

Continued...

Size X-Large only:

Round 6: Ch 1, hdc in first 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st] 9 times; join with slip st in first st—60 hdc.

Round 7: Ch 1, hdc in first 11 sts, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in next 11 sts, 2 hdc in next st] 4 times; join with slip st in first st—65 hdc.

Rounds 8–17: Ch 1, hdc in each st around; change to **D** at end of last round; join with slip st in first st. Do not fasten off.

Right Earflap

Row 1: Ch 2 (counts as first dc here and throughout), skip first 2 sts, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next st, skip next st, dc in next st, turn—6 dc and 1 ch-1 space.

Rows 2–8 (9, 10, 11, 12): Ch 2, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-1 space, dc in top of beginning ch, turn. Fasten off.

With right side of right earflap facing and back seam to the right, count to the left from earflap and place marker on 18th (20th, 22nd, 24th, 26th) st.

Left Earflap

With right side facing, join **D** with slip st in marked st and work same as right earflap.

Edging

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing, join **A** with sc in any st at center back between earflaps, *sc in each st to next earflap; working in ends of rows down first side, 2 sc in each row, sc in each st of Row 8 (9, 10, 11, 12); working in ends of rows up other side, 2 sc in each row; repeat from * once, sc in each remaining st; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With **B**, following pompom maker directions, make three 2" (5 cm) pompoms or make pompoms as follows: Wrap yarn around 2" (5 cm) piece of heavy cardboard (the more wraps, the fuller the pompom). Gently remove wraps from cardboard. Cut a 12" (30.5 cm) length of **B** and tie it tightly around center of wraps. Do not cut the ends of this center tie. Cut ends of wraps. Fluff and trim pompom. Use ends of center tie to attach pompoms. Tie one pompom to top of hat through Round 1 and one pompom through ch-1 space at end of each earflap. Weave in ends.



For Child's size Small, skip to Instep now.

Row 8: K5, M1, K(18, 20), (M1, K1) twice, K(18, 20), M1, K5--(52, 56) sts.

Row 9: Knit.

Row 10: K6, M1, K(19, 21), (M1, K1) twice, K(19, 21), M1, K6--(56, 60) sts.

Instep

Rows 1 and 3: Knit.

Rows 2 and 4: Purl.

For Child's size Small, skip to Row 7 now.

For Child's sizes Medium and Large, continue as follows:

Row 5: Knit.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K25 (32, 35), ssk, turn.

Rows 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, and 18:

Slip 1, P6 (8, 10), P2tog, turn.

Rows 9, 11, 13, 15, and 17:

Slip 1, K6 (8, 10), ssk, turn.

For Child's size Small, skip to Row 25 now.

For Child's sizes Medium and Large, continue as follows:

Rows 19, 21, and 23: Slip

1, K(8, 10), P2tog, turn.

Rows 20, 22, and 24: Slip 1, P(8, 10), SSK, turn.

Row 25: Slip 1, K6 (8, 10), SSK, knit to end of row--31 (37, 41) sts.

Row 26: P18 (22, 25), P2tog, purl to end of row--30 (36, 40) sts.



Cuff

Change to **C**. Knit 6 rows.

Bind off.

Continued...

FINISHING

With yarn needle, seam down back of heel and across length of center sole. Weave in ends.

MOM'S SLIPPER (Make two)

Sole

With **A**, cast on 40 (50, 58) sts.

Rows 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9: Knit

Row 2: K2, M1, K17 (22, 26), (M1, K1) twice, K17 (22, 26), M1, K2--44 (54, 62) sts.

Row 4: K3, M1, K18 (23, 27), (M1, K1) twice, K18 (23, 27), M1, K3--48 (58, 66) sts.

Row 6: K4, M1, K19 (24, 28), (M1, K1) twice, K19 (24, 28), M1, K4--52 (62, 70) sts.

Row 8: K5, M1, K20 (25, 29), (M1, K1) twice, K20 (25, 29), M1, K5--56 (66, 74) sts.

Row 10: K6, M1, K21 (26, 30), (M1, K1) twice, K21 (26, 30), M1, K6--60 (70, 78) sts.

For Women's size Small, skip to Instep now.

For Women's sizes Medium and Large, continue as follows:

Row 11: Knit.

Row 12: K7, M1, K(27, 31), (M1, K1) twice, M1, K(27, 31), M1, K7--(75, 83) sts.

Instep

Rows 1 and 3: Knit.

Rows 2 and 4: Purl.

For Women's size Small, repeat

Rows 1-4, then skip to Row 9.

For Women's sizes Medium and Large, continue as follows:

Row 5: K(25, 28), ssk, K3tog, ssk, K(11, 13), K2tog, K3tog, K2tog, K(25, 28)--(67, 75) sts.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: K(21, 24), ssk, K3tog, ssk, K(11, 13), K2tog, K3tog, K2tog, K(21, 24)--(59, 67) sts.

Row 8: Purl.

Row 9: K35 (35, 40), ssk, turn.

Rows 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, and

26: Slip 1, P10 (11, 13), P2tog, turn.

Rows 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23, and

25: Slip 1, K10 (11, 13), ssk, turn.

Row 27: Slip 1, K10 (11, 13), ssk, knit to end of row--41 (40, 48) sts.

Row 28: P25 (25, 30), P2tog, purl to end of row--40 (39, 47) sts.



Cuff

Change to **B**. Knit 6 rows.

Bind off.

FINISHING

With yarn needle, seam down back of heel and across length of center sole. Weave in ends.

Boy Bow Tie measures 4¼" [11 cm] wide x 1¾" [4.5 cm] high

Adult Bow Tie measures 4½" [11.5 cm] wide x 2¼" [5.5 cm] high

Directions are for size Boy; changes for size Adult are in parentheses

BOW TIE

Using **A** and smaller hook for Boy or larger hook and **B** for Adult, ch 37 (33).

Row 1: Working in back loops, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 36 (32) sts.

Row 2: (Right Side) Ch 1, turn, working in both loops, sc in each sc across – 36 (32) sts.

Rows 3-7: Repeat Row 2.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

CENTER BAND

Using **A** and smaller hook for Boy or larger hook and **B** for Adult, ch 11 (12).

Row 1: Working in back loops, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 10 (11) sts.

Row 2: (Right Side) Ch 1, turn, working in both loops, sc in each sc across – 10 (11) sts.

For Adult Only

Row 3: Repeat Row 2.

For Both Sizes

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

COLLAR

Using **A** and smaller hook for Boy or larger hook and **B** for Adult, ch 60 (70).

Row 1: Working in back loops, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 59 (69) sts.

Row 2: (Right Side) Ch 1, turn, working in both loops, sc in each sc across – 59 (69) sts. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew short ends of Bow Tie together to form a loop. Flatten loop, positioning seam in center of back. Sew top and bottom edges closed. With wrong side facing, fold a "W" pleat lengthwise along center 1" [2.5 cm] of Bow Tie and sew in place.

With right sides facing, position Bow Tie in center of Collar. Wrap Center Band around tucked center of Bow Tie and Collar and sew ends together on wrong side of Collar. Sew 1 (2) button on one short end of Collar, adjusting to fit comfortably around neck. Use space between sts as buttonholes. Weave in ends.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3 (Decrease Row): *K1, p1, k2tog, p2tog; repeat from * to last st, k1—41 sts.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5 (Decrease Row): *K2tog, p2tog; repeat from * to last st, k1—21 sts.

Rows 6 and 7: Repeat Rows 4 and 5—11 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through remaining stitches and remove stitches from needle. Pull to gather and close top opening. Sew side edges together for back seam.



Repeat Rows 2 and 3 for Ribbing until piece measures approximately 2½" (6 cm) from cast on edge, ending by working a right side row.

BEANIE

Row 1 and ALL WRONG SIDE

ROWS: P1, *P4, K2, P5, K2, P4, K2; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 2 (Right Side): P1, *P2, CF4, P2, K5, P2, CB4; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 4: P1, *P2, K4, P2, K5, P2, K4; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 6: P1, *P2, K4, P9, K4; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Repeat Rows 1-6 until Beanie measures approximately 7" (18 cm) from cast on edge, ending by working Row 6.

CROWN SHAPING

Row 1: P1, *P4, K2tog, P5, K2tog, P4, K2tog; repeat from * across to last st, P1—66 sts.

Row 2 (Right Side): P1, *P1, CF4, P1, K5, P1, CB4; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 3: P1, *P4, K1, P5, K1, P4, K1; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 4: P1, *P1, K4, P1, SSK, K1, K2tog, P1, K4; repeat from * across to last st, P1—58 sts.

Row 5: P1, *P4, K1, P3, K1, P4, K1; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 6: P1, *P1, K4, P1, K3tog, P1, K4; repeat from * across to last st, P1—50 sts.

Row 7: P1, *P4, K1, P1, K1, P4, K1; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 8: P1, *P1, (K2tog) twice, P1, K1, P1, (K2tog) twice; repeat across to last st, P1—34 sts.

Row 9: P1, *P2, K1, P1, K1, P2, K1; repeat from * across to last st, P1.

Row 10: P1, *P1, K2tog, P1, K1, P1, K2tog; repeat from * across to last st, P1—26 sts.

Row 11: P2tog across—13 sts.

FINISHING

Cut yarn, leaving a 15" (38 cm) tail. Thread yarn needle with tail and weave through remaining stitches. Draw up firm; fasten securely. With right sides together and matching stitches, sew seam. With **A**, make one medium size pompom and attach securely to crown of Beanie.

RED BEANIE RIBBING

With **B**, cast on 78 sts.

Row 1 (Right Side): With **A**, purl across.

2. Border is worked in 1x1 Rib worked in rounds.
3. Without binding off, the back is folded and stitches are picked up across the cast-on edge to begin working the border in rounds.
4. There is no top or bottom to the finished piece. Insert arms into openings on sides of back. Border will fold around back of neck to form collar. Front of border can be worn open or pinned with a shawl pin or brooch.

BACK

Cast on 28 (32, 36, 40, 44) sts. Work back and forth in rows on circular needle as if working with straight needles. Work in Garter st (knit every row) until piece measures 16 (17, 18, 19)" (40.5 (43, 45.5, 45.5, 48.5) cm) from beginning, end with a wrong side row. Do not bind off.



BORDER

Round 1 (right side): Knit one more row of back, fold piece in half to bring cast-on edge up to needle, pick up and k1 st in each cast-on st—56 (64, 72, 80, 88) sts. Place marker to indicate beginning of round. Prepare to work in rounds.

Round 2 (increase round): Kfb in each st around—112 (128, 144, 160, 176) sts.

Round 3: *K1, p1; repeat from * around. Repeat last round for 6" (15 cm) or desired length. Bind off loosely.



Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in first dc, *dc in each of next 3 dc, [dc3tog over next 3 ch] twice, dc in each of the next 3 dc*, 3 dc in each of next 2 dc; repeat from * to * once, 3 dc in top of ch-3 turning ch; turn.

Rows 3-4: Repeat Row 2. Change to **B** at end of Row 4. Fasten off **A**.

Rows 5-112: Repeat Row 2, working in the following color sequence: *4 rows **B**; 4 rows **A**; repeat from * ending with 4 rows **B**. Fasten off, leaving a long sewing length.

Finishing

Weave in ends. Block scarf. Sew short ends together matching sts.

Side Edging

Row 1: With right side facing, join **B** with slip st around the post of first row-end dc on one side of scarf, ch 1, work 2 sc in each row-end st around edge of scarf, join with a slip st in first sc—224 sc. Fasten Off.

Finished Length: 20 (21½, 23, 24½)" (51 (54.5, 58.5, 62) cm)

Special Techniques

3-Needle Bind-Off = Hold needles of stitches to be seamed parallel and with right sides together, with 3rd needle knit together first stitch from each needle, *knit together next stitch from each needle, pass first stitch over 2nd stitch and off right needle; repeat from * until all stitches have been knit from the 2 parallel needles and only one stitch remains on the right needle. Fasten off.

Crocheted Slip Stitch Seam = Begin with a slip knot on the hook, *with yarn in back of work, insert hook from front to back through both thicknesses and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook (one loop remains on hook); repeat from * across to complete seam. Fasten off.

Pattern Stitch

Lace Pattern (over an odd number of sts)

Note: Slip stitches as if to purl.

Row 1 (right side): K1, *yo, slip 1, k1, yo, pass the slipped st over the knit st and yo and off the right needle; rep from * across.

Row 2: *P2, drop the next yo off the needle; repeat from * to last st, p1.

Row 3: K2, *yo, slip 1, k1, yo, pass the slipped st over the knit st and yo and off the right needle; repeat from * to last st, k1.

Row 4: P3, *drop the next yo off the needle, p2; repeat from * across.
Repeat Rows 1–4 for Lace pattern.

Notes

1. Boutique Swanky yarn is absolutely stunning, and will make a spectacular sweater to wear either for special events or with jeans. There are a couple of factors to be aware of that will enhance your experience in making this pattern. The yarn is heavy so figure all measurements by holding your work up allowing it to drape then carefully laying it flat to maintain the hanging length. It is also multi-ply so can split if using sharp needles. The open work stitch pattern is very easy, but has a lot of yarn overs which tighten up on the cable of circular needles. Because of these factors, straight, blunt-tipped needles are recommended. Since the yarn is slippery, bamboo works better than slick metal.
2. Back and Front are worked separately, back and forth in rows, beginning at the lower edge.
3. Stitches are picked up across armhole edge of body to begin each Sleeve. Each Sleeve is worked from shoulder downwards.
4. It is easier to count rows by counting the ridges on the wrong side: every two rows make one ridge.

BACK

With larger straight needles, cast on 85 (89, 95, 99) sts loosely. Work in Garter st (knit every row) for 3 rows. Work in Lace pattern until piece measures about 13 (14, 15, 16)" (33 (35.5, 38, 40.5) cm) from beginning; end with a wrong side row.

Continued...

Shape Armholes

Notes:

- When instructed to work in Lace pattern “as established”, work the next row of the Lace pattern lining up the stitches as in previous rows. This may require working more or fewer stitches before beginning the */repeat portion of the instruction.
- When binding off a yo, bind off the yo along with the k1 and count this as only 1 stitch bound-off.

Row 1 (right side): Bind off 8 sts, work in Lace pattern as established to end of row—77 (81, 87, 91) sts.

Row 2: Bind off 8 sts, work in Lace pattern as established to end of row—69 (73, 79, 83) sts. Work even in Lace pattern as established until armholes measure about 7 (7½, 8, 8½)” (18 (19, 20.5, 21.5) cm); end with a wrong side row.

Shape Neck and Shoulders

Row 1 (right side): K14 and place these 14 sts on a holder for right shoulder, k1, *k2tog, pass 2nd st on right needle over first st and off needle; repeat from * across to last 13 sts (1 st remains on right needle), k13 and place these last 14 sts on a holder for left shoulder.

FRONT

Work same as Back until piece measures about 18 (19½, 21, 22½)” (45.5 (49.5, 53.5, 57) cm) from beginning; end with a wrong side row. Note: The armhole shaping should be complete.

Divide for Neck

Row 1 (right side): Work in Lace pattern as established over first 20 sts and place these sts on a holder for left front, k1, *k2tog, pass 2nd st on right needle over first st and off needle; repeat from * across to last 19 sts (1 st remains on right needle), work in Lace

pattern as established over last 19 sts—20 sts remain on needle for right front.

Right Front

Next Row (wrong side): Work in Lace pattern as established.

Next Row (right side): K3tog, work in Lace pattern as established to end of row—18 sts. Repeat last 2 rows 2 more times—14 sts. Work even in Lace pattern as established until right front side of entire piece measures same as Back; end with a wrong side row. Place stitches on a holder.

Left Front

Return left front stitches from holder to larger straight needles, ready to work a wrong side row.

Next Row (wrong side): Work in Lace pattern as established.

Next Row (right side): Work in Lace pattern as established to last 3 sts, k3tog—18 sts. Repeat last 2 rows 2 more times—14 sts. Work even in Lace pattern as established until left front side of entire piece measures same as Back; end with a wrong side row. Place stitches on a holder.

Join shoulders with 3-Needle Bind-Off.

Neckband

With right side facing and circular needle, beginning at right shoulder seam, pick up and k32 (34, 36, 38) sts evenly spaced across back neck, 14 sts down left front neck edge, 16 (18, 20, 22) sts across front neck, and 14 sts up right front neck edge—76 (80, 84, 88) sts. Place a marker for beginning of round and prepare to work in rounds.

Round 1: Purl.

Round 2: Knit.

Bind off loosely as if to purl.

SLEEVES (make 2)

With right side facing and larger straight needles, beginning immediately following underarm bound-off edge, pick up and k38 (39, 40, 41) sts evenly spaced across armhole edge to shoulder seam, pick up and k1 st in shoulder seam, pick up and k38 (39, 40, 41) sts across armhole edge to other underarm bound-off edge—77 (79, 81, 83) sts. Work even in Lace pattern for 7 rows. Place a marker at each end of the last row worked. Continue to work even in Lace pattern until piece measures 18 (18, 19, 19)” (45.5 (45.5, 48.5, 48.5) cm) from beginning; end with a wrong side row.

Cuff

Change to smaller straight needles.

Row 1 (right side): *K2tog; repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3tog—38 (39, 40, 41) sts. Work in Garter st for 6 rows. Bind off as if to knit.

FINISHING




With right sides of pieces together and crochet hook, using Crochet Slip Stitch Seam technique, slip stitch the underarm bound-off edges of Front and Back to marked sections at top of Sleeves. Slip stitch the side and sleeve seams. Weave in ends.



Special Stitch

dangle = Ch 11, working in 2 loops, (slip st, ch 5, slip st, ch 7, slip st, ch 5, slip st, ch 4, slip st) in 4th ch from hook, slip st in last 7 ch.

Special Technique

Adjustable-ring method = Wrap yarn into a ring, ensuring that the tail falls behind the working yarn. Grip ring and tail firmly between middle finger and thumb. Insert hook through center of ring, yarn over (with working yarn) and draw up a loop. Work stitches of first round in the ring, working over both strands (the tail and the ring). After the first round of stitches is worked, pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring.

Notes

1. Scarf is worked back and forth in rows from top down with increases made in corner chain spaces.
2. Border of dangles is made on 2 side edges. Be careful not to twist chains as you work dangles.

SCARF

Make an adjustable ring.

Row 1 (right side): Ch 2 (counts as first hdc here and throughout), (2 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) (corner made) in ring, turn—6 hdc and 1 ch-2 space. Pull gently, but firmly, on tail to tighten ring but do not close completely.

Row 2: Ch 2, 2 hdc in first st, ch 2, (3 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) (corner made) in corner ch-2 space, ch 2, 3 hdc in top of beginning ch-, turn—12 hdc and 3 ch-2 spaces.

Row 3: Ch 2, 2 hdc in first st, ch 2, 3 hdc in next ch-2 space, ch 2, (3 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) (corner made) in corner ch-2 space, ch 2, 3 hdc in next ch-2 space, ch 2, 3 hdc in top of beginning ch, turn—18 hdc and 5 ch-2 spaces.



Row 4: Ch 2, 2 hdc in first st, *ch 2, 3 hdc in next ch-2 space*; repeat from * to * across to corner ch-2 space, ch 2, (3 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) (corner made) in center ch-2 space, repeat from * to * across, ch 2, 3 hdc in top of beginning ch, turn—24 hdc and 7 ch-2 spaces.
Rows 5–27: Repeat Row 4 twenty-three times, do not turn at end of last row—162 hdc and 53 ch-2 spaces.

Border

Row 1 (right side): Working across ends of rows, evenly space [dangle, 3 sc] 25 times down first side to first ch-2 space, 3 dangles in first corner ch-2 space; evenly space [3 sc, dangle] 25 times up other side; join with slip st in end of row. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Finished Length: 24 (24, 25, 25, 26, 26)" (61 (61, 63.5, 63.5, 66, 66) cm)

Note

Piece will lengthen as you work and as piece is worn.

Special Stitches

beg-half-shell (beginning half shell) = Ch 5 (counts as tr, ch 1), tr in indicated stitch or space.

beg-shell (beginning shell) = Ch 4 (counts as tr), (tr, ch 1, 2 tr) in indicated stitch or space.

Fsc (foundation single crochet – This technique creates a foundation chain and a row of single crochet stitches in one) =

First st: Ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 1 loop on hook (the "chain"), yarn over and draw through both loops on hook (the "single crochet").

Remaining sts: *Insert hook in "chain" of previous stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over, draw through 1 loop on hook (the "chain"), yarn over and draw through both loops on hook; repeat from * for desired number of stitches.

half-shell = (Tr, ch 1, tr) in indicated stitch or space.

inc-shell (increase shell) = (Tr, ch 1, 2 tr, ch 1, tr) in indicated stitch or space.

sc2tog (single crochet 2 together) = [Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

shell = (2 tr, ch 1, 2 tr) in indicated stitch or space.

tr2tog (treble crochet 2 stitches together) = *[Yarn over] twice, insert hook in next st, yarn over and pull up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice; repeat from * once more, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook. **Note:** When instructed to work a tr2tog "over" two stitches (the particular two stitches will be specified in the instructions), work the tr2tog and the first time you need to insert the hook into a stitch, insert it into the first of the specified stitches. The second time you need to insert the hook into a stitch, insert it into the 2nd of the specified stitches.

Notes

1. Tunic is worked in joined rounds beginning at the neck edge. When piece reaches underarm, stitches are skipped to create armholes. Work then continues, in joined rounds, down to the lower edge over the remaining body stitches only.
2. Sleeves are worked directly into the armholes and worked down to the cuff edge.

YOKE

Round 1 (right side): Fsc 62 (64, 66, 68, 70, 72); join with slip st in first sc to form a ring. Note: The strip of Fsc should measure about 20½ (21½, 22, 22½, 23½, 24½)" (52 (54.5, 56, 57, 59.5, 62) cm) when laid flat.

Round 2 (increase): Ch 1, [sc in next 7 (5, 6, 4, 5, 4) sts, 2 sc in next st] 7 (10, 9, 12, 11, 14) times, sc in each remaining st around; join with slip st in first sc—69 (74, 75, 80, 81, 86) sts.

Round 3 (increase): Ch 1, [sc in next 5 (4, 4, 4, 4, 3) sts, 2 sc in next st] 11 (14, 13, 16, 15, 18) times, sc in each remaining st around; join with slip st in first sc—80 (88, 88, 96, 96, 104) sts.

Continued...

Round 4: Beg-shell in same st as joining, *[skip next 3 sts, shell in next st] 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) times, skip next 3 sts, inc-shell in next st, [skip next 3 sts, shell in next st] 3 times, skip next 3 sts, inc-shell in next st, [skip next 3 sts, shell in next st] 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) times, skip next 3 sts, inc-shell in next st, [skip next 3 sts, shell in next st] 3 times, skip next 3 sts, inc-shell in next st, skip next 3 sts join with slip st in top of beginning ch—16 (18, 18, 20, 20, 22) shells and 4 inc-shells (for 24 (26, 26, 28, 28, 30) ch-1 spaces)

Round 5: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 6: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each of next 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 4 ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 6 (7, 7, 8, 8, 9) ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 4 ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—20 (22, 22, 24, 24, 26) shells and 4 inc-shells (for 28 (30, 30, 32, 32, 34) ch-1 spaces).

Round 7: Repeat Round 5.

Round 8: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each of next 6 (7, 7, 8, 8, 9) ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 5 ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 7 (8, 8, 9, 9, 10) ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in next 5 ch-1 spaces, inc-shell in next ch-1 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—24 (26, 26, 28, 28, 30) shells and 4 inc-shells (for 32 (34, 34, 36, 36, 38) ch-1 spaces).

Next 1 (2, 3) Rounds: Repeat Round 5.

Form Armholes

Round 1: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each of next 6 (7, 7, 8, 8, 9) ch-1 spaces, half-shell in next ch-1 space; beginning by inserting hook in top vertical strand of last tr made, work 3

(3, 5, 5, 7, 7) Fsc (underarm base made), skip next 7 ch-1 spaces for armhole, half-shell in next ch-1 space, shell in each of next 7 (8, 8, 9, 9, 10) ch-1 spaces, half-shell in next ch-1 space; beginning by inserting hook in in top vertical strand of last tr made, work 3 (3, 5, 5, 7, 7) Fsc (underarm base made), skip next 7 ch-1 spaces form armhole, half-shell in last ch-1 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—14 (16, 16, 18, 20) shells, 4 half-shells, and 2 underarm bases (for 18 (18, 20, 20, 22, 24) ch-1 spaces).

Note: If making size 1X or 2X, when working across underarm bases in Round 2, work a half-shell (instead of a shell) in the center Fsc of each underarm base to slightly reduce bulk under the arm.

Round 2: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, *shell in each ch-1 space to next underarm base, skip first Fsc of underarm base, [shell in next Fsc, skip next Fsc] 1 (2, 3) time(s); repeat from * once more, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 30) shells (for 20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 30) ch-1 spaces).

Rounds 3-16: Repeat Round 5.

Round 17: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, ch 4, 4 tr) in next ch-1 space (counts as 5-tr group), 5 tr in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 30) 5-tr groups. Fasten off.

LEFT SLEEVE

Sizes Small (Medium) Only:

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing draw up a loop in last ch-1 space of armhole (just before underarm base), beg-shell in same ch-1 space, tr2tog over next ch-1 space of body (in which a half-shell has already been worked) and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the side of the armhole opening, ch 1, tr2tog over the post of the same tr and the base of the center Fsc of the underarm base, ch 1, tr2tog over the

same underarm base st, and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the other side of the armhole opening, ch 1, tr2tog over the post of the same tr and the next ch-1 space (in which a half-shell has already been worked), shell in each of the remaining 6 ch-1 spaces of armhole; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—10 ch-1 spaces.

Round 2: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, tr2tog over next 2 ch-1 spaces (at underarm), ch 1, tr2tog over same ch-1 space and next ch-1 space, shell in each remaining ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—8 ch-1 spaces.

Rounds 3-11: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 12: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, ch 4, 4 tr) in next ch-1 space (counts as 5-tr group), 5 tr in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Sizes Large (1X, 2X, 3X) Only:

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing draw up a loop in last ch-1 space of armhole (just before underarm base), beg-shell in same ch-1 space, tr2tog over next ch-1 space of body (in which a half-shell has already been worked) and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the side of the armhole opening; working across unworked side of underarm base, skip the first st of underarm base, [half-shell in next st, skip the next st] 2 (2, 3, 3) times, tr2tog over the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the other side of the armhole opening and the next ch-1 space of the body (in which a half-shell has already been worked), shell in each of the remaining 6 ch-1 spaces of armhole; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 (9, 10, 10) ch-1 spaces.

Round 2: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, tr2tog over the space between the 2 legs of next tr2tog and the

next ch-1 space, half-shell in same ch-1 space, half-shell in next 0 (0, 1, 1) ch-1 spaces, (2 tr, ch 1, tr) in next ch-1 space, tr2tog over same ch-1 space and the space between the 2 legs of next tr2tog, shell in each remaining ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 (9, 10, 10) ch-1 spaces.

Rounds 3-12 (12, 13, 13): Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 13 (13, 14, 14): Slip st in next tr, (slip st, ch 4, 4 tr) in next ch-1 space (counts as 5-tr group), 5 tr in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

RIGHT SLEEVE

Sizes Small (Medium) Only:

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing draw up a loop in last ch-1 space of armhole (immediately following underarm base), beg-shell in same ch-1 space, shell in next 6 ch-1 spaces of armhole, tr2tog over next ch-1 space (in which a half-shell has already been worked) and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the side of the armhole opening, ch 1, tr2tog over the post of the same tr and the base of the center Fsc of the underarm base, ch 1, tr2tog over the same underarm base st, and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the other side of the armhole opening, ch 1, tr2tog over the post of the same tr and the next ch-1 space (in which a half-shell has already been worked); join with slip st in top of beginning ch—10 ch-1 spaces.

Round 2: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in next 6 ch-1 spaces, tr2tog over next 2 ch-1 spaces (at underarm), ch 1, tr2tog over same ch-1 space and next ch-1 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—8 ch-1 spaces.

Continued...

Rounds 3–11: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 12: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, ch 4, 4 tr) in next ch-1 space (counts as 5-tr group), 5 tr in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Sizes Large (1X, 2X, 3X) Only:

Round 1 (right side): With right side facing draw up a loop in last ch-1 space of armhole (immediately following underarm base), beg-shell in same ch-1 space, shell in next 6 ch-1 spaces of armhole, tr2tog over next ch-1 space of body (in which a half-shell has already been worked) and around the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the side of the armhole opening; working across unworked side of underarm base, skip the first st of underarm base, [half-shell in next st, skip the next st] 2 (2, 3, 3) times, tr2tog over the post of the outer tr of the half-shell that forms the other side of the armhole opening and the next ch-1 space of the body (in which a half-shell has already been worked); join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 (9, 10, 10) ch-1 spaces.

Round 2: Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in next 6 ch-1 spaces, tr2tog over the space between the 2 legs of next tr2tog and the next ch-1 space, half-shell in same ch-1 space, half-shell in next 0 (0, 1, 1) ch-1 spaces, (2 tr, ch 1, tr) in next ch-1 space, tr2tog over same ch-1 space and the space between the 2 legs of next tr2tog; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 ch-1 spaces.

Rounds 3–12 (12, 13, 13): Slip st in next tr, (slip st, beg-shell) in next ch-1 space, shell in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

Round 13 (13, 14, 14): Slip st in next tr, (slip st, ch 4, 4 tr) in next ch-1 space (counts as 5-tr group), 5 tr in each ch-1 space around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch.

FINISHING


Neckband (optional)

Note: Working additional round around neck opening will make neck a bit smaller. If you work the number of decreases (sc2tog) specified in Round 1, the neckline will be about 20" (51 cm) around. Work more or fewer decreases to achieve the desired fit.

Round 1: With right side facing, draw up a loop at center back of neck edge, ch 1, sc in each st around, working 4 (6, 8, 10, 12, 14) sc2tog evenly spaced around; join with slip st in first sc—58 sts. Weave in ends.

Ruffled Fleece Blanket

Here's an easy, quick way to have a glamorous blanket for a girl of any age! Do a row of blanket stitches around purchased fleece fabric, knit the ruffle and then sew the ruffle on through the blanket stitches.

Blanket measures 48" x 48" (122 x 122 cm), not including ruffle.

Special Technique

Working with Fabric Yarn: First spread **B** open with loop edge at top and wider fabric edge at bottom. Continue to spread the fabric yarn open as you work so that you can see the holes and strands of the top loop edge. Stitches are made by inserting the needle into the hole and knitting the uppermost strand. Always insert the needle from the front to the back through each hole. Working in every hole gathers the yarn into dense ruffles.

Notes

1. Blanket is made from precut square of fleece fabric edged in blanket stitches. Ruffle is knitted separately and sewn to blanket stitches.
2. When joining one ball of fabric yarn to the next, you may choose to overlap last and first loops and work these joining stitches through both "thicknesses".

BLANKET

With fabric marker and beginning at any corner, mark small dots ¼" (6.35 mm) from edge and spaced ¼" (6.35 mm) apart. With yarn needle threaded with **A**, work blanket stitch around edges, inserting needle in each dot. At each corner work 3 blanket stitches allowing center stitch to lie over point of corner. Fasten off. Following manufacturer's instructions, remove dotted markings.

Ruffle

To cast on, insert needle from back to front through first 3 holes of **B**. Knit each hole, using top strand as working yarn, until all four balls are knitted into one continuous ruffle.


FINISHING

With **A**, sew knitted edge of ruffle (**B**) to blanket stitches. Weave in ends.

RED HEART® Grande™: 8 balls 307 Oatmeal A and 10 balls 110 Aran B

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 10mm [US P-15]

Plastic yarn needle, stitch marker, child's small bean bag chair

GAUGE: 11 sts = 8" (20.5 cm); 7 rows = 4" (10 cm) in single crochet.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

Stylish Pouf

You'll love having this perfectly striped pouf around to lean on or to rest your feet. It can be crocheted very easily (even by a beginner) and then a child's bean bag chair is used for the stuffing.

Pouf measures 27" diameter x 15" high x 87" circumference (68.5 x 38 x 221 cm).

Notes

1. Pouf is made with top, side, and bottom panels worked in continuous rounds with right side facing. Side panel is worked downward from top panel.
2. Pouf cover is intended to fit snugly around the bean bag. Purchase a bean bag that is slightly larger than the cover. The assembled pieces may appear to be too small to accommodate the bean bag but the yarn will stretch.
3. To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color. Cut old color.

POUF

Bottom Panel

With **A**, ch 4; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.

- Round 1 (right side):** Ch 1, 6 sc in ring, do not join—6 sc. Place marker for beginning of round and move marker up as each round is completed.
- Round 2:** Work 2 sc in each st around—12 sc.
- Round 3:** *Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around—18 sc.
- Round 4:** *Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st; repeat from * around—24 sc.
- Round 5:** *Sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around; change to **B**—30 sc.
- Round 6:** *Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts; repeat from * around—36 sc.
- Round 7:** *Sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around—42 sc.
- Round 8:** *Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts; repeat from * around—48 sc.
- Round 9:** *Sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around—54 sc.

Round 10: *Work 2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 sts; repeat from * around; change to **A**—60 sc.

Round 11: *Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts; repeat from * around—66 sc.

Round 12: *Sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts; repeat from * around—72 sc.

Round 13: *Sc in next 11 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around—78 sc.

Round 14: *Sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 9 sts; repeat from * around—84 sc.

Round 15: *Sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts; repeat from * around; change to **B**—90 sc.

Round 16: *Sc in next 10 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts; repeat from * around—96 sc.

Round 17: *Sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 11 sts; repeat from * around—102 sc.

Round 18: *Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts; repeat from * around—108 sc.

Round 19: *Sc in next 12 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts; repeat from * around—114 sc.

Round 20: *Work 2 sc in next st, sc in next 18 sts; repeat from * around—120 sc. Fasten off.

Top Panel

Work same as bottom panel but do not fasten off at end of Round 20. Begin side panel.

Side Panel

Round 1 (right side): Working in back loop only, sc in each st around; change to **A**.

Round 2: Sc in each st around; change to **B**. Repeat Round 2 until side measures 15" (38 cm) (or length that will fit over bean bag when slightly stretched), changing color at end of each round and carrying color not in use on wrong side until next needed, ending with **B** round. Fasten off **A**. Do not fasten off **B**.

Continued...

FINISHING

To minimize weaving in, draw all ends to wrong side of piece. Insert bean bag into cover. Place bottom panel on bean bag. To close pouf, working through front loops only of bottom and side panels, slip st in each st around; join with slip st in first slip st. Fasten off. Flatten top and bottom panels. Weave in ends.
